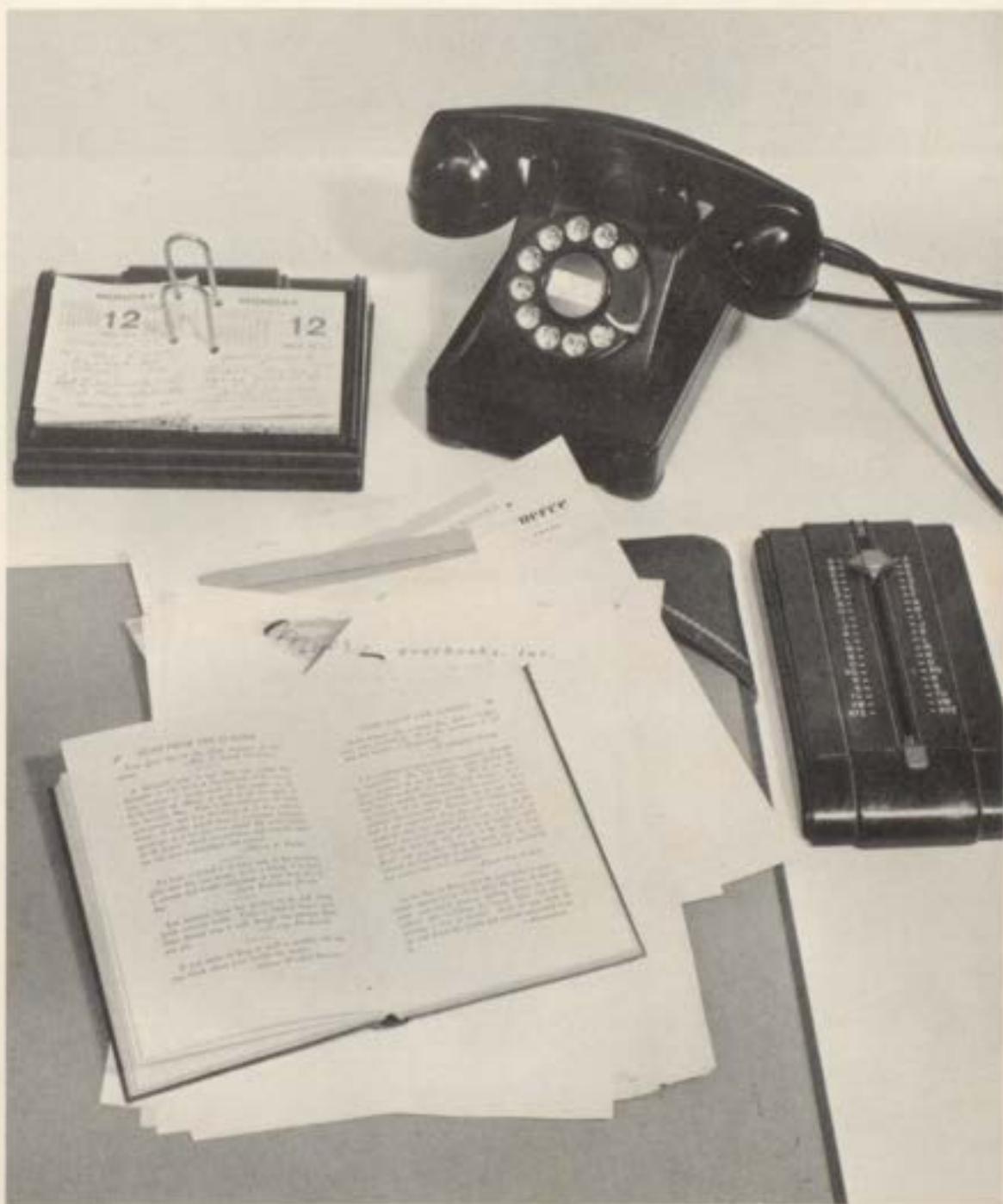
# We'll Remember

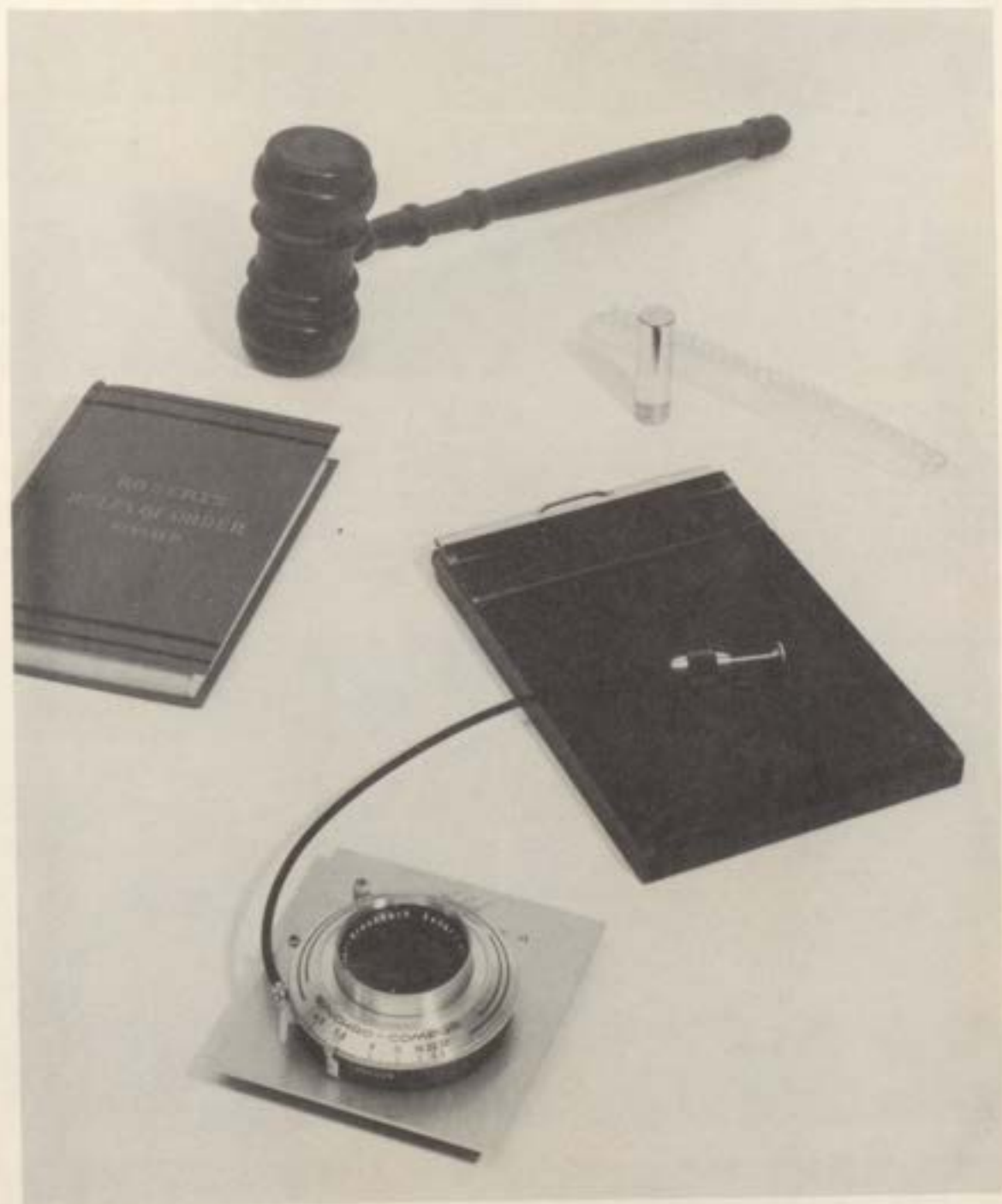
