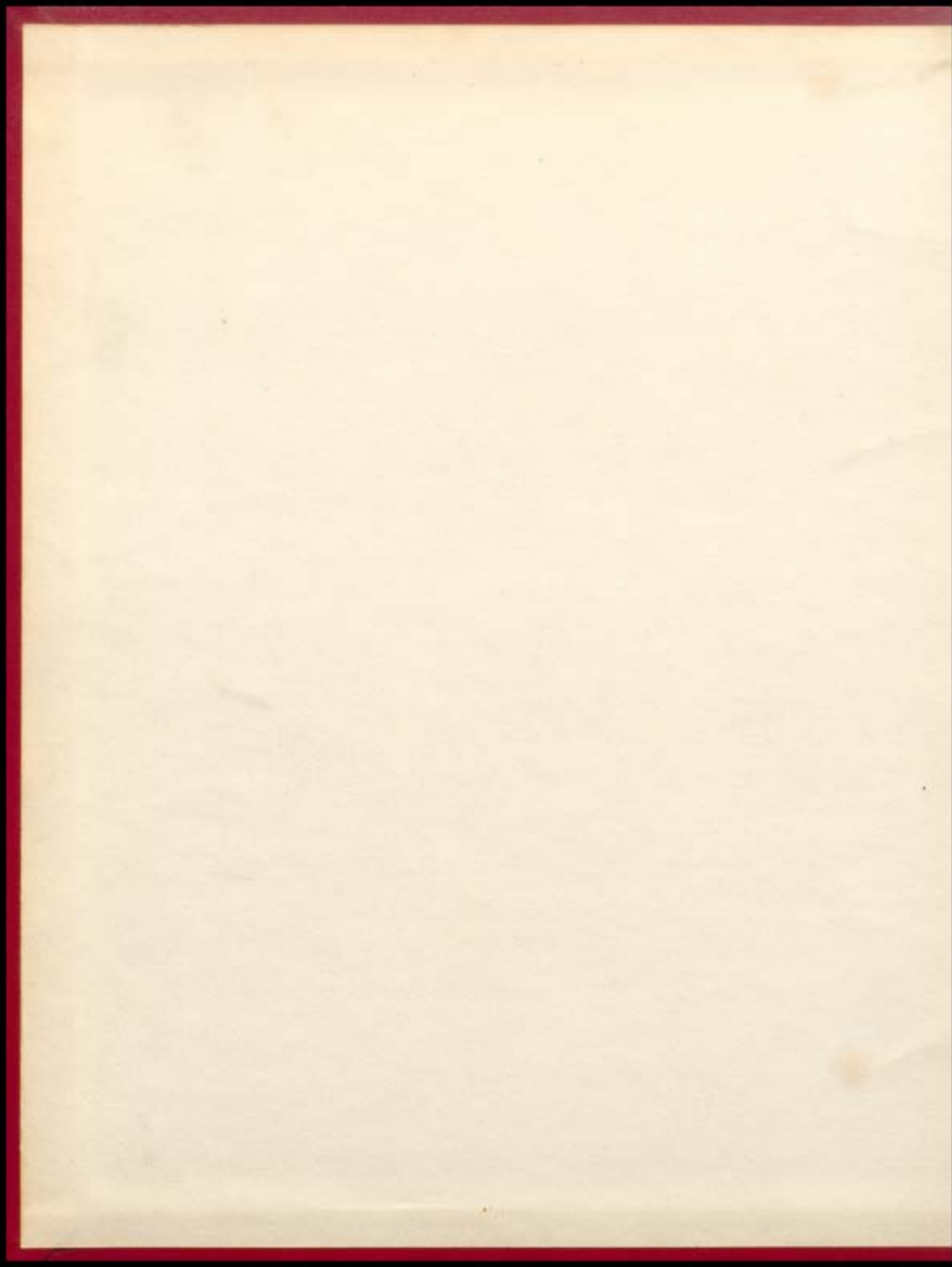
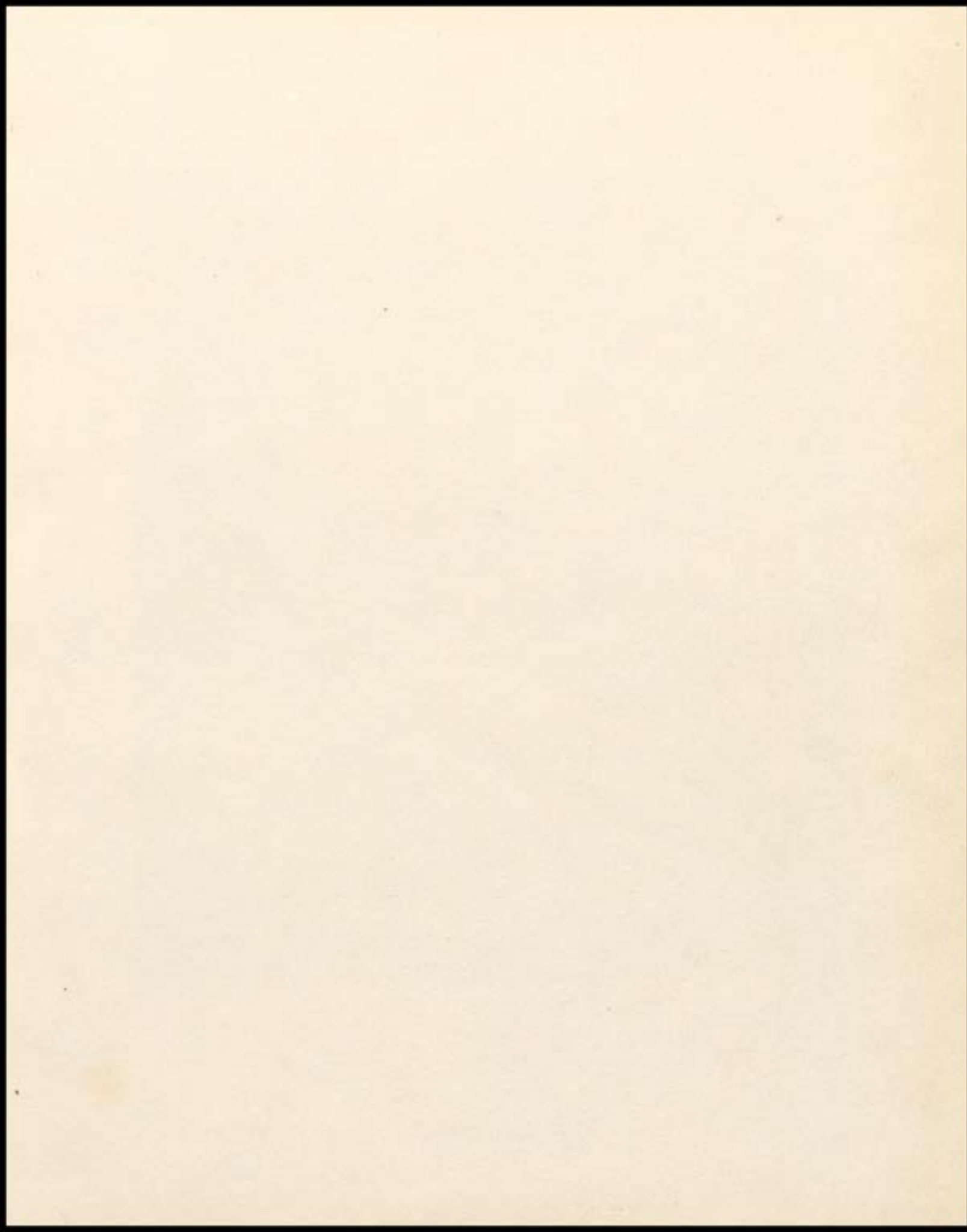

## Principal's Message

Can you accept responsibility? The right answer to this question on your part will go a long way to help determine your future happiness, as well as success.

We love to spend our time reciting to others the many kinds of liberty which we have. And yet we fail to assume the responsibility that naturally follows these liberties. For liberty means responsibility. That is why so many of us dread it, fear it, and are not ready for it.

We are prone to misunderstand the American idea of democracy or freedom. The real idea of democracy is, not that every man shall be on a level with every other, but that every one shall have the liberty to make of himself what God would have him be. But this is impossible for any of us unless we are willing to accept the responsibility that goes with it.

Some parents fail to develop in their children a sense of responsibility in the home, in society, in the church, in the school. But let us not be misled by this failure. But rather let us sense the basic truth, that if we are to have liberty or democracy in either or all of these four fundamental institutions, we must be ready and willing to accept our individual responsibility at all times. We must be able to make decisions and accept the responsibility for them; we must determine our own conduct and be willing to accept the responsibility for it; we must determine the kind of home, society, church, and school we would have and then we must determine in our own mind our responsibility for such, and be willing to accept it.

About the finest thing that could happen to this or any other community would be to have every member of our senior classes extend the do-it-yourself movement far enough to include thinking: What is my individual responsibility? Am I willing to accept it and meet it? Am I willing to spend the time, the effort, and the money necessary to meet it? Your answers to these questions will determine your happiness and your worth to your home, your community, your church, and to your school.

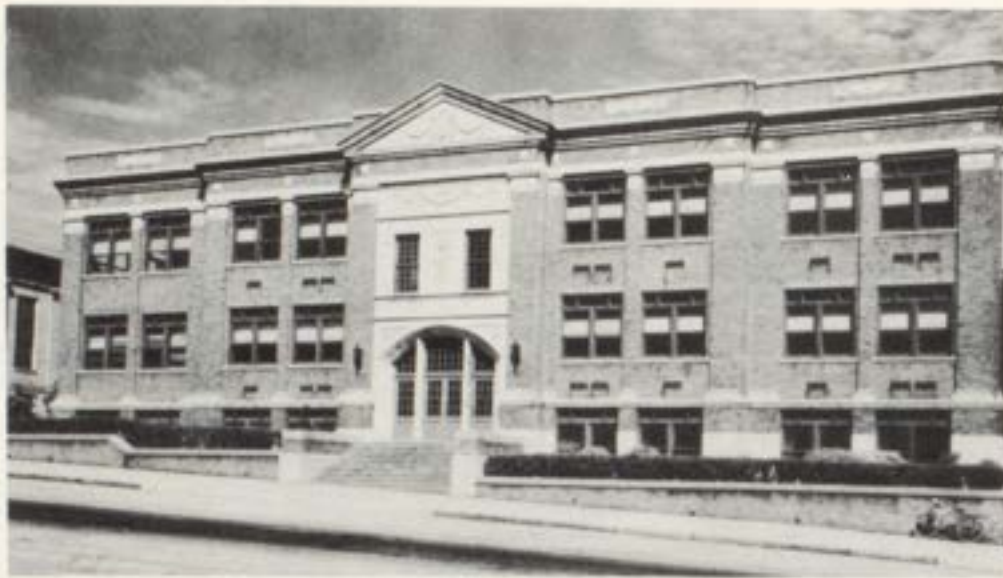

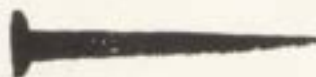
