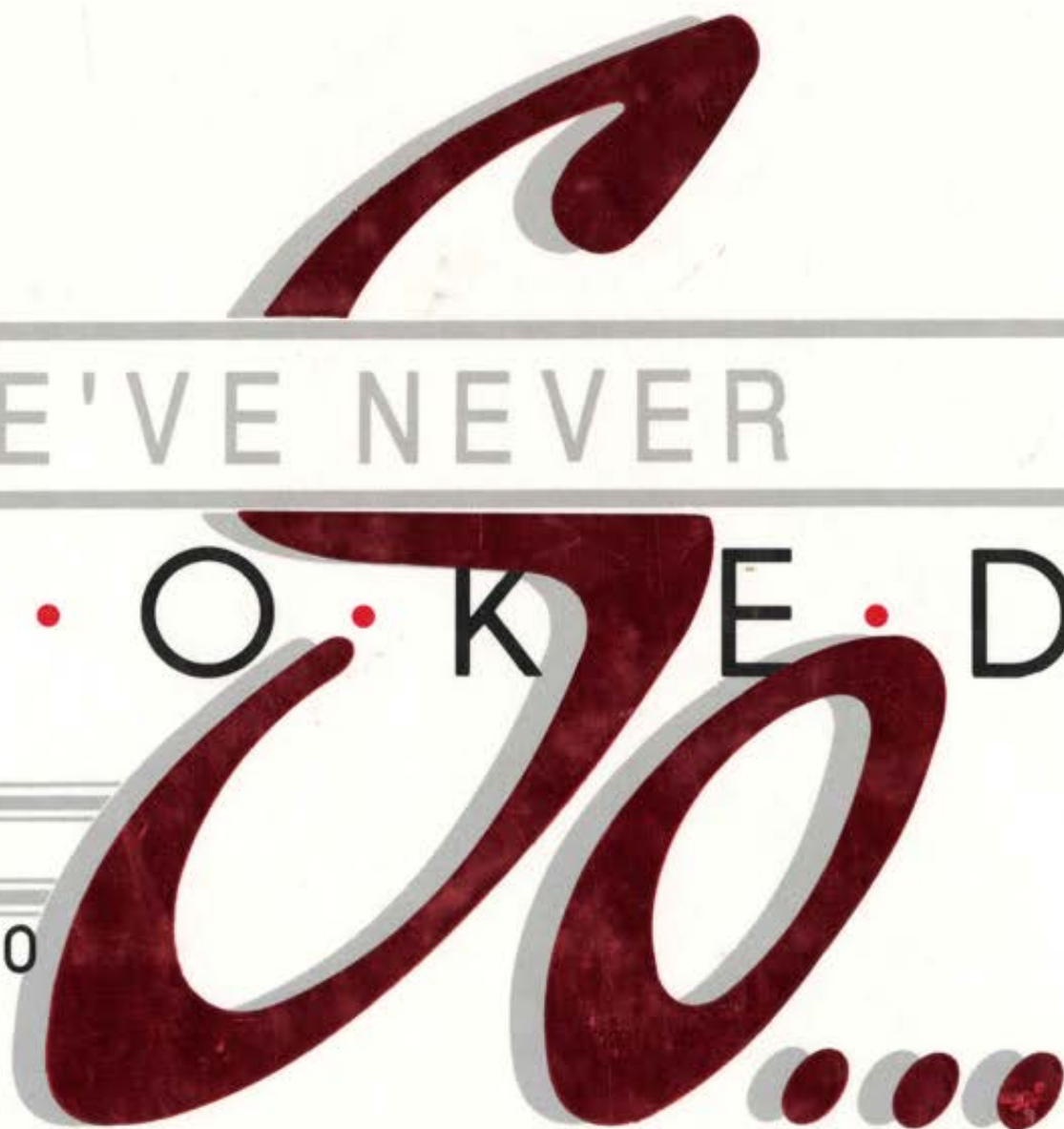

were all there with the hopes of not running into Mr. Meyer.

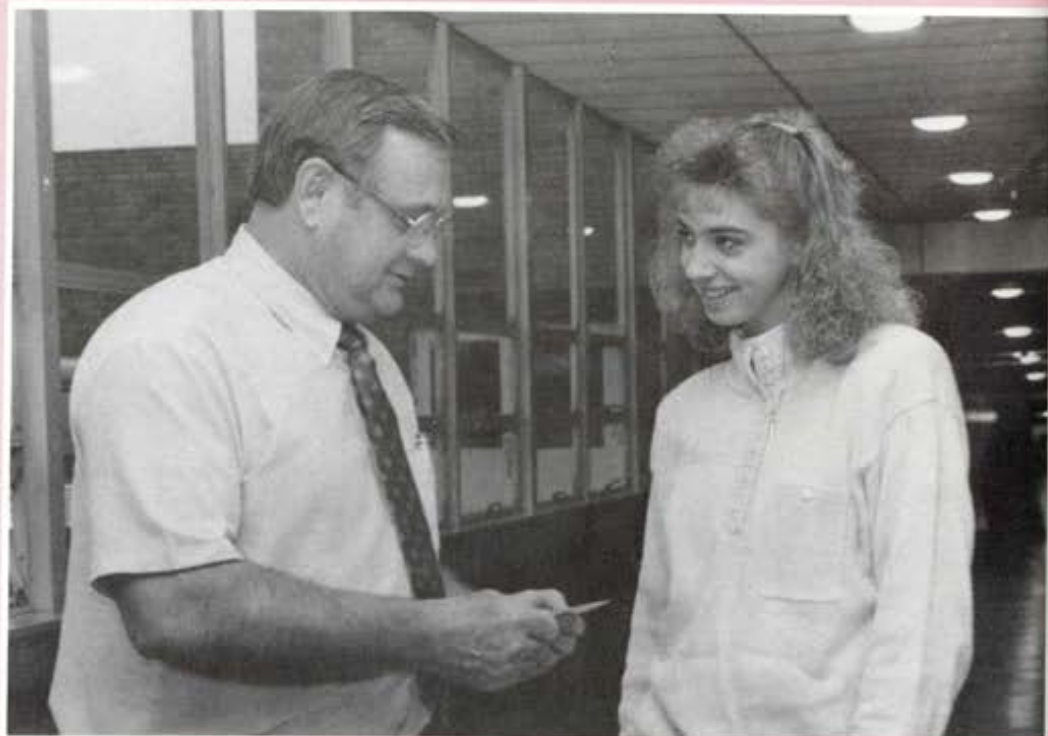
Many students found the halls to be a relaxing and enjoyable place to meet friends. The students of MCHS made the hallways what they were, and the hallways "Never Looked So Good!"

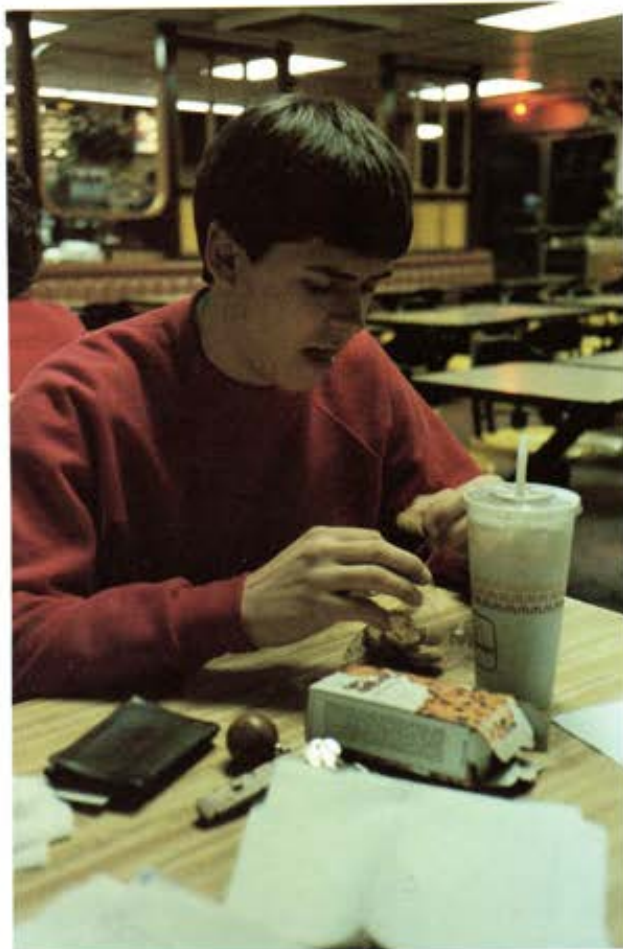

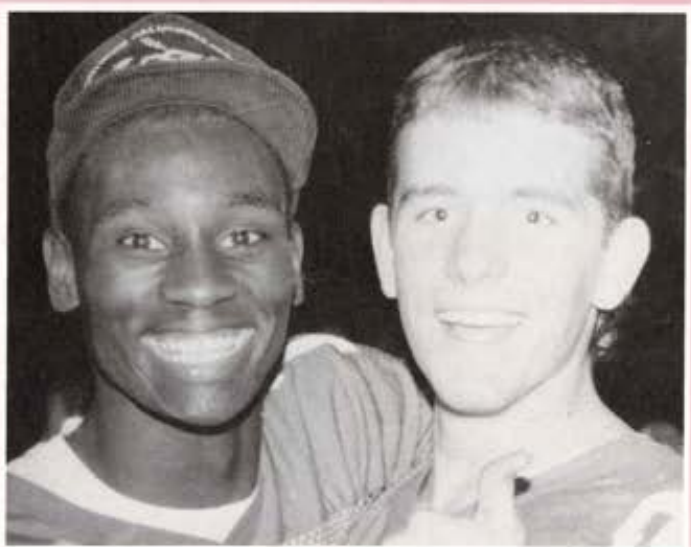
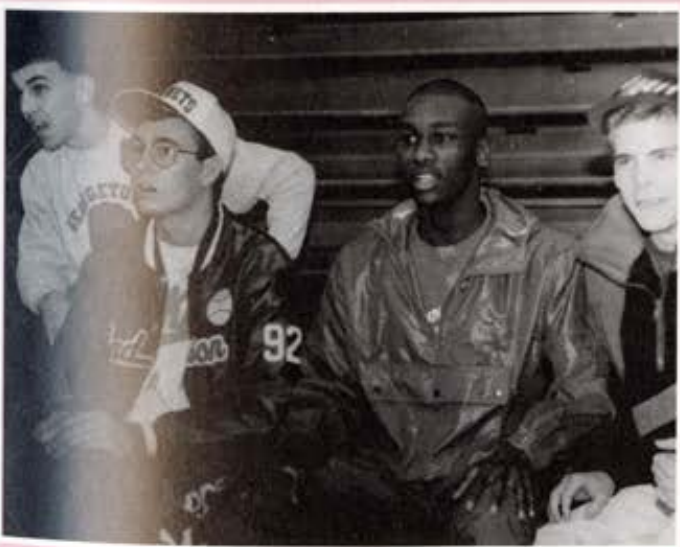
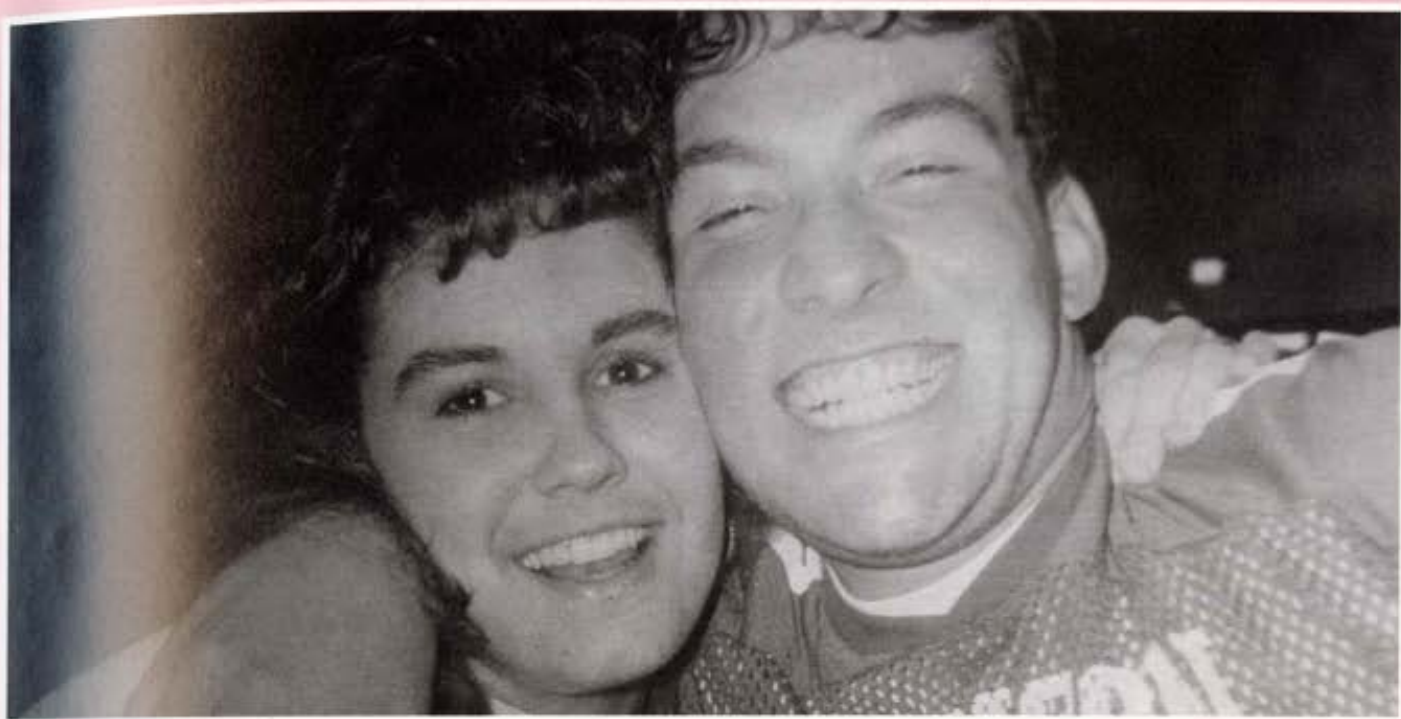
"The friendships made throughout the year will last a lifetime and influence us to achieve many goals," stated by the class of 1990. Cherish the friendships and fun times.

December brought many things to mind, Christmas, snow, and new winter coats. But to the minds of the MCHS students only one event stood evident — The Annual Christmas Dance.

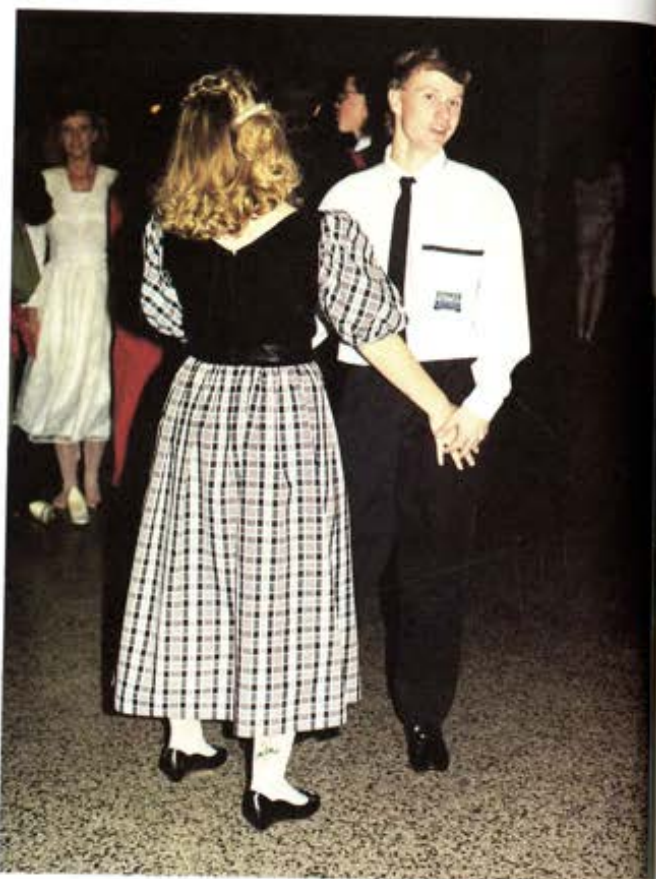

As the finals approached both junior teams went down fighting. The battle was now between the Class of 1990 and the Class of 1992.

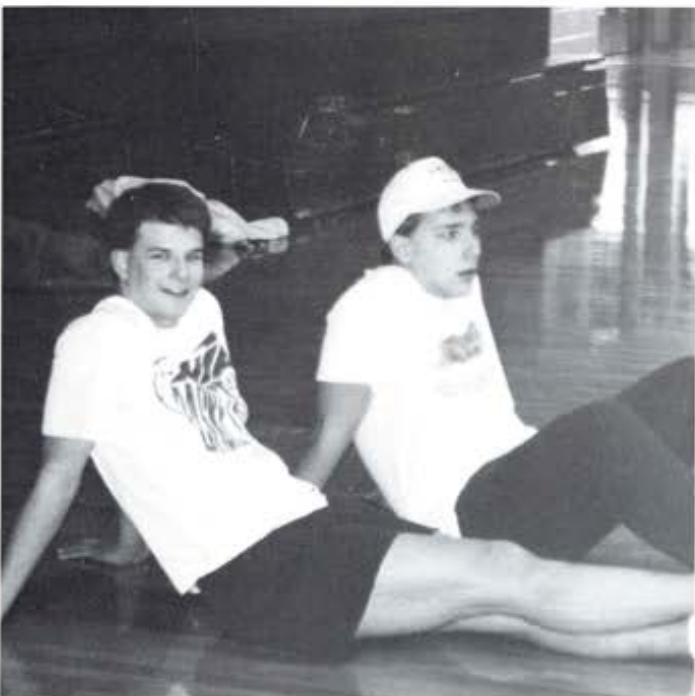

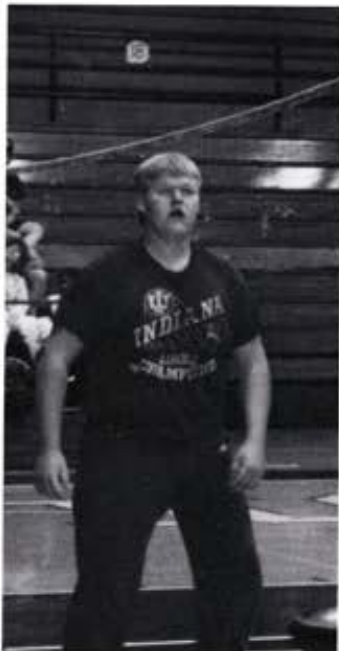

Mr. Deffenbaugh also involved students in summer workshops including listening and communication skills.

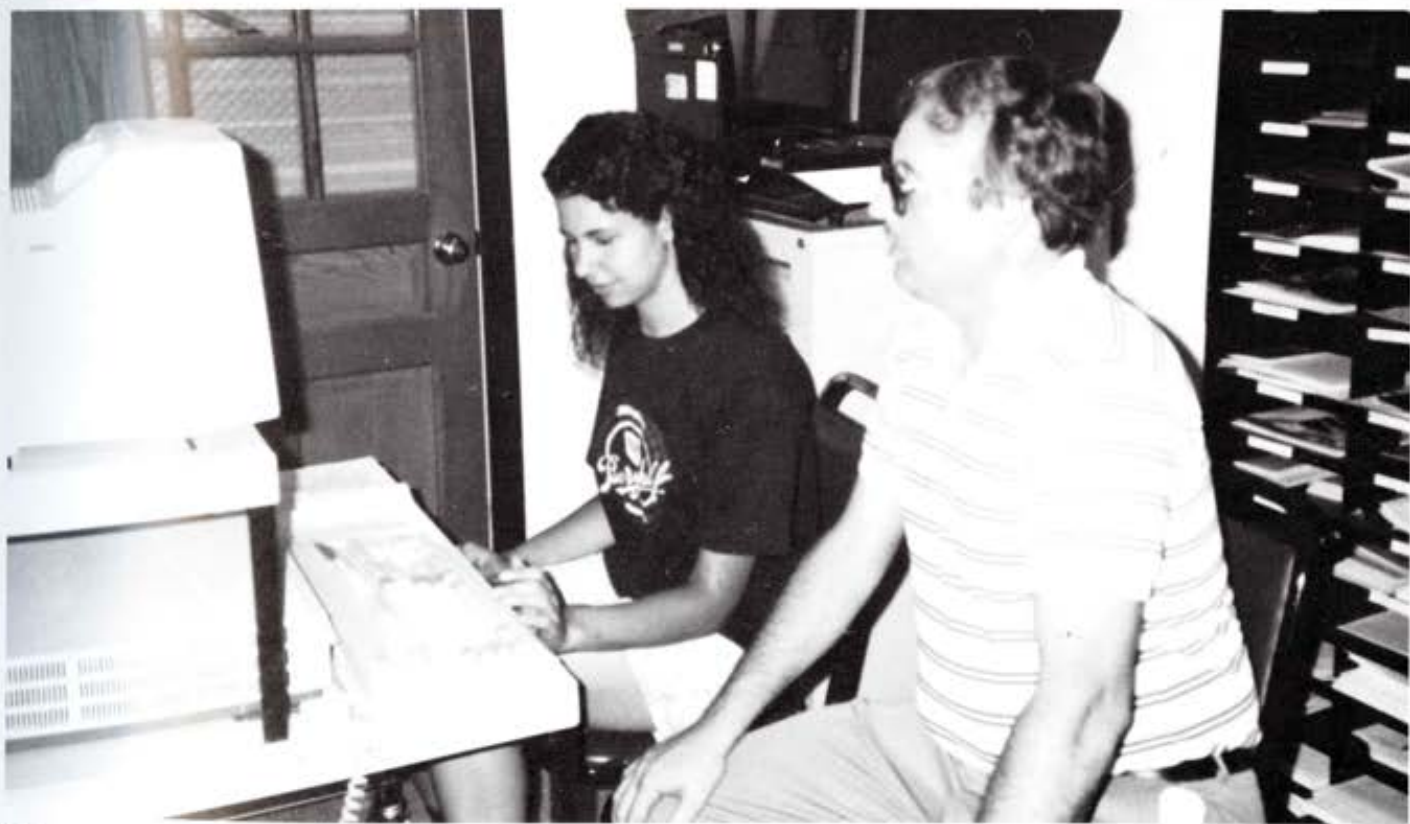

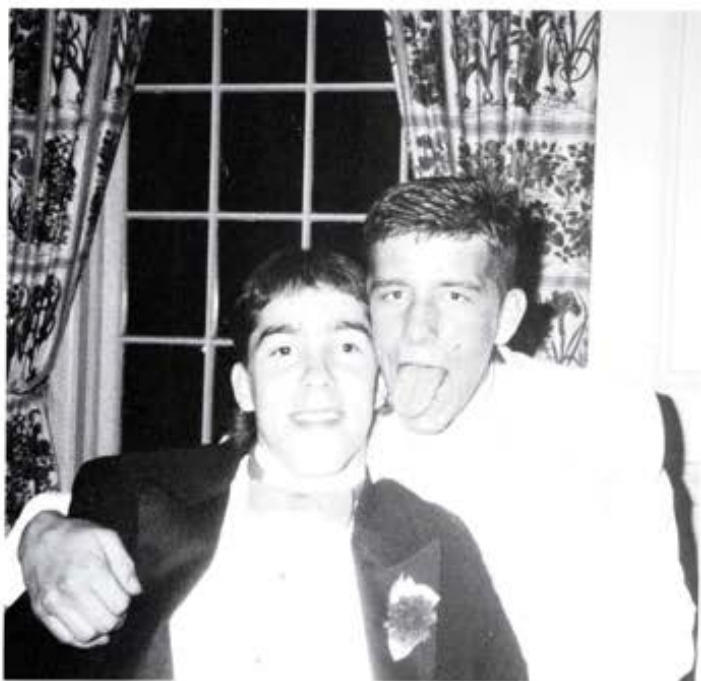

## "HERE AND NOW"

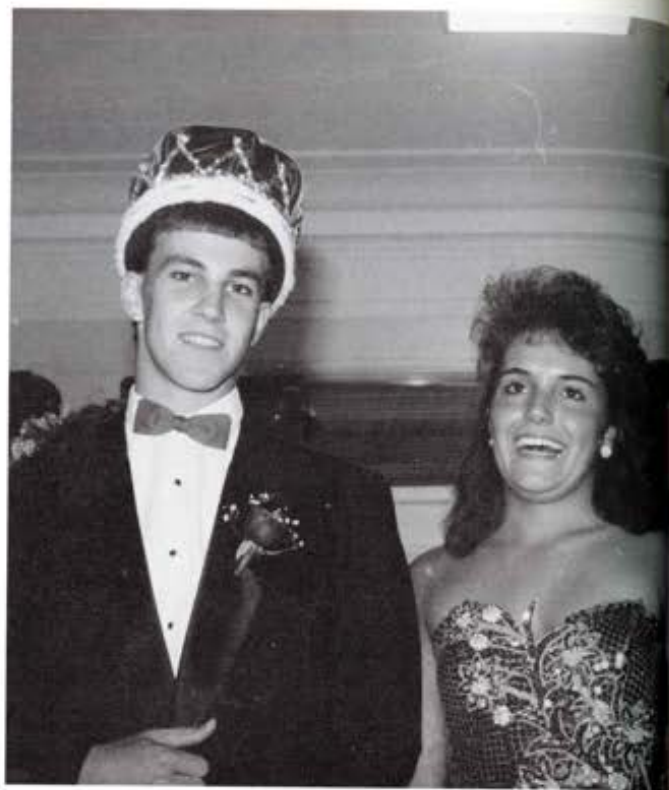
Without a doubt the biggest highlight of the evening of prom was the crowning of King and Queen and Prince and Princess.

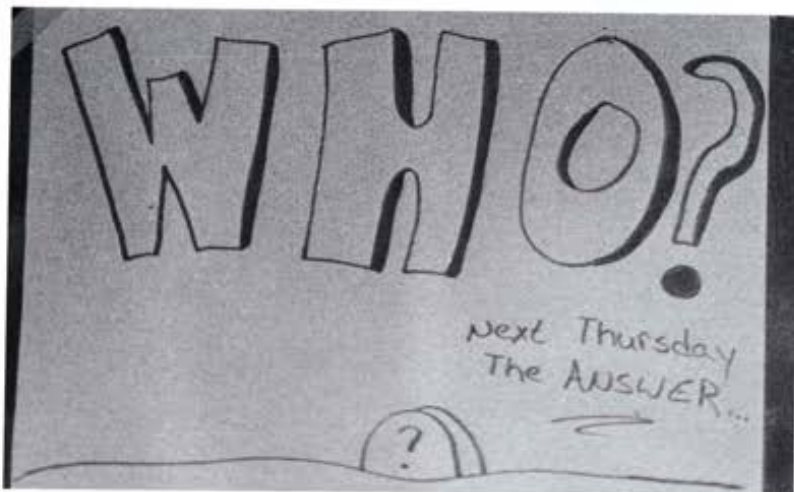

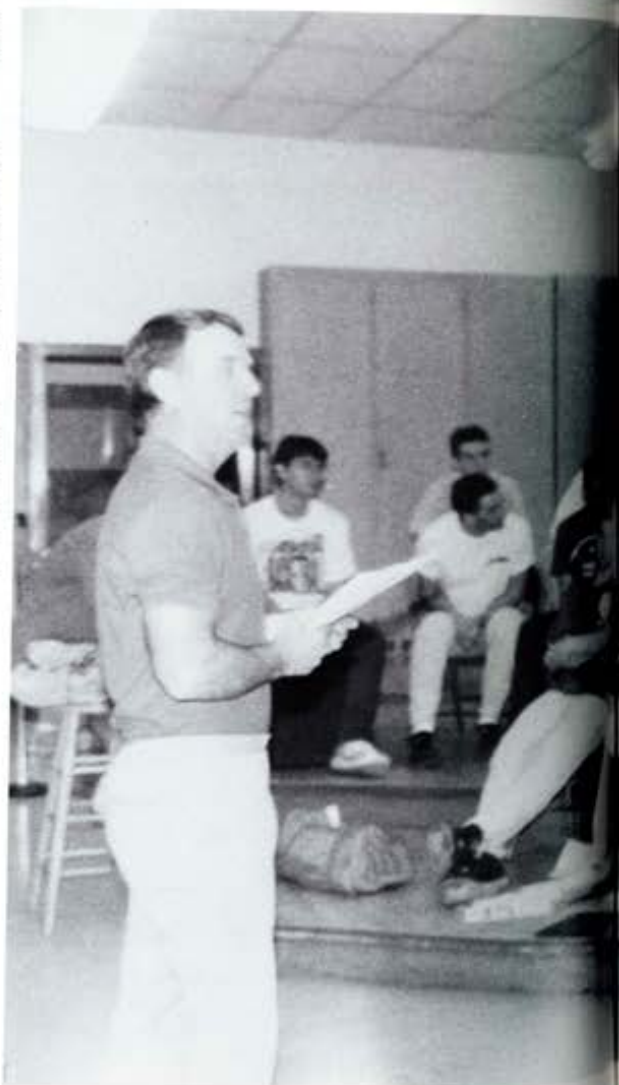
Quill Society was made up of outstanding journalism students who excelled in their journalistic areas and were also good citizens. This organization was an honorary society that students were inducted into

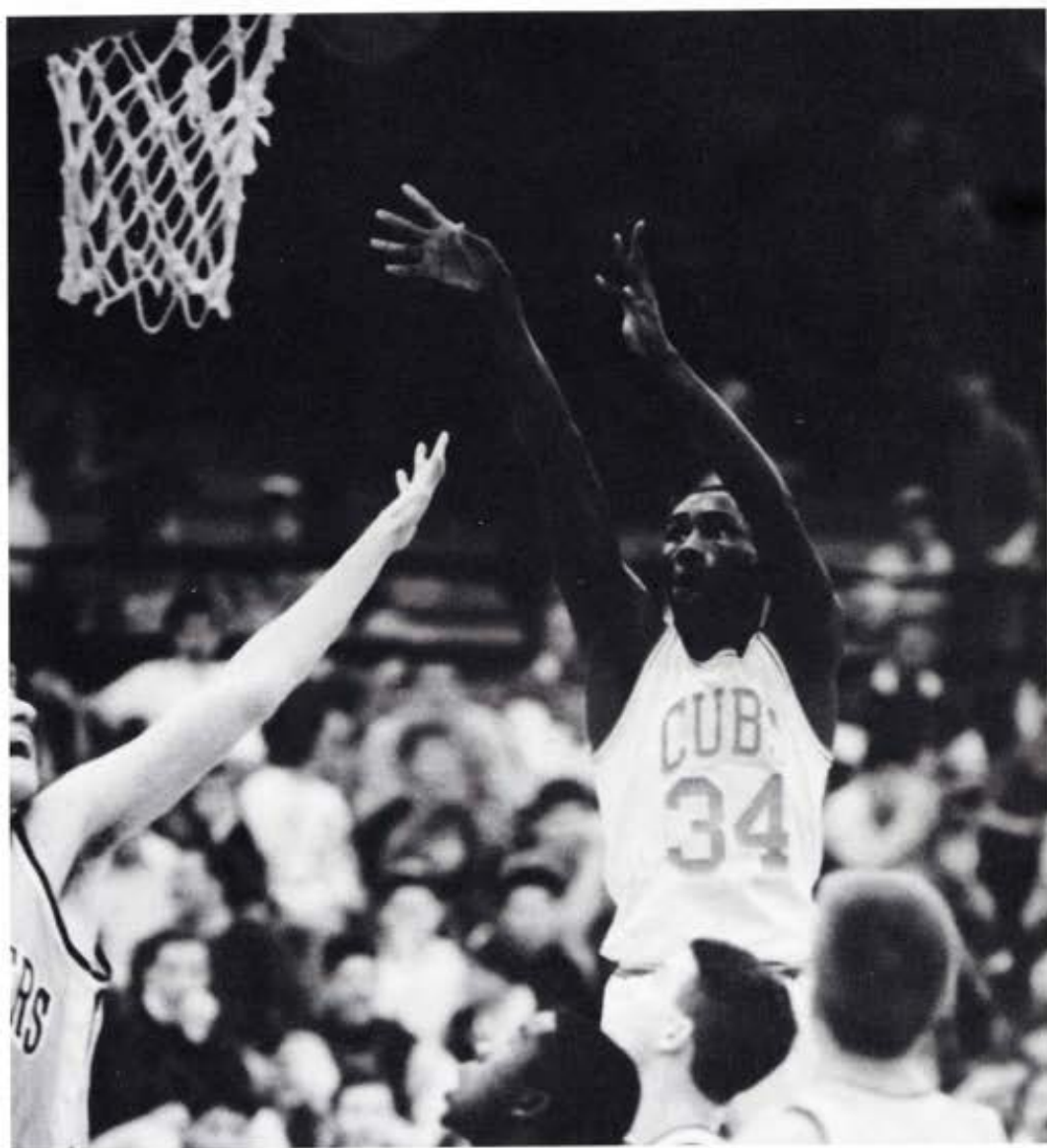

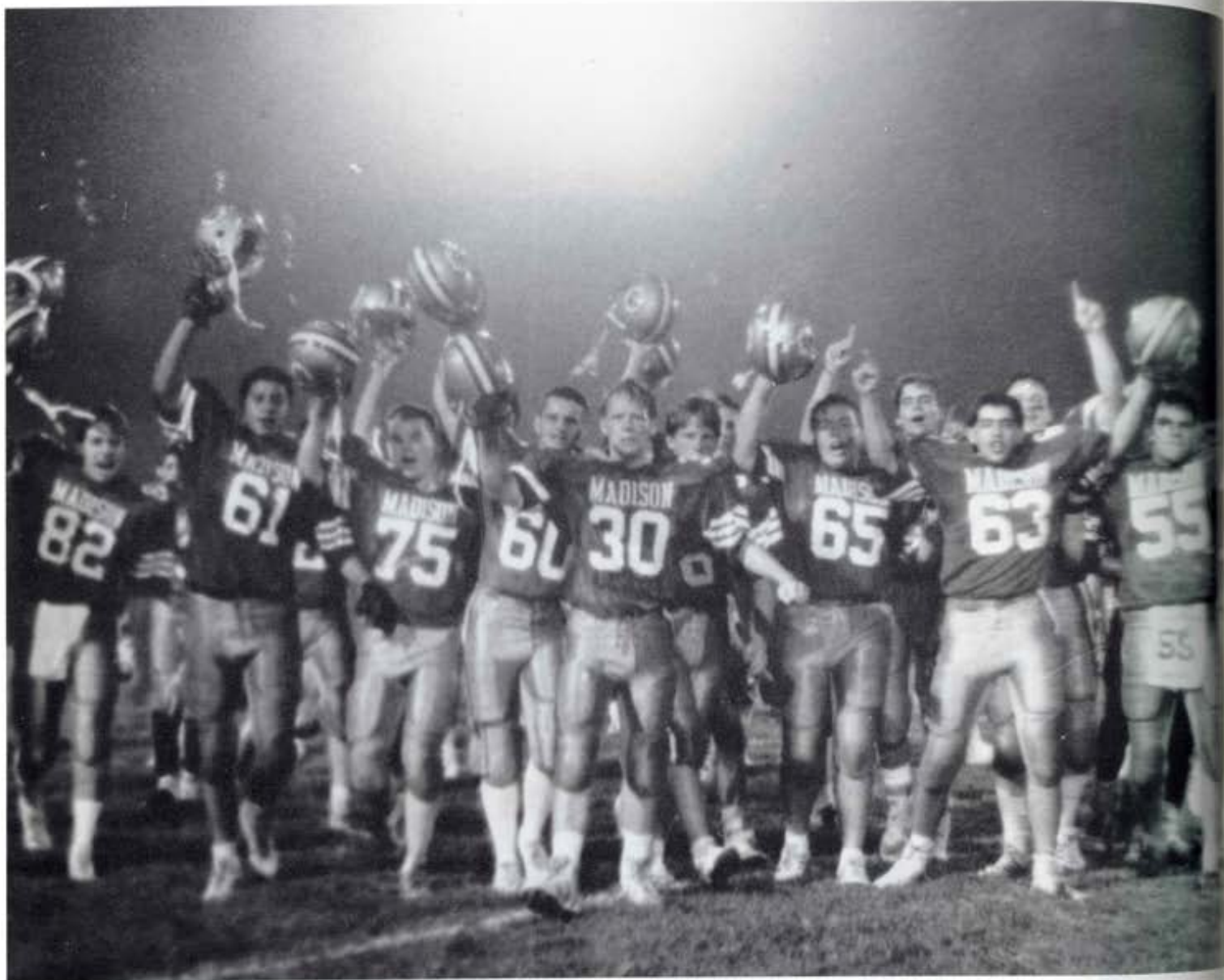
Whether it was through the success of an individual, or the accomplishments of a team, Madison discovered the benefits of looking *SO SPORTY*.

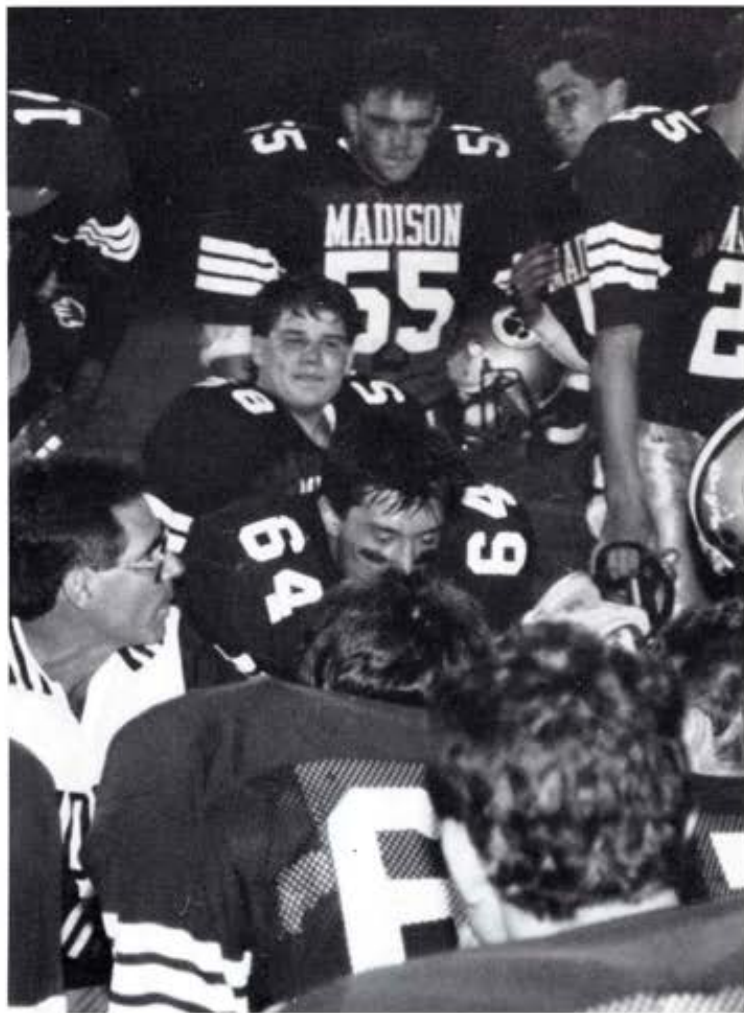

have a successful season," stated junior, Mickey Geer.

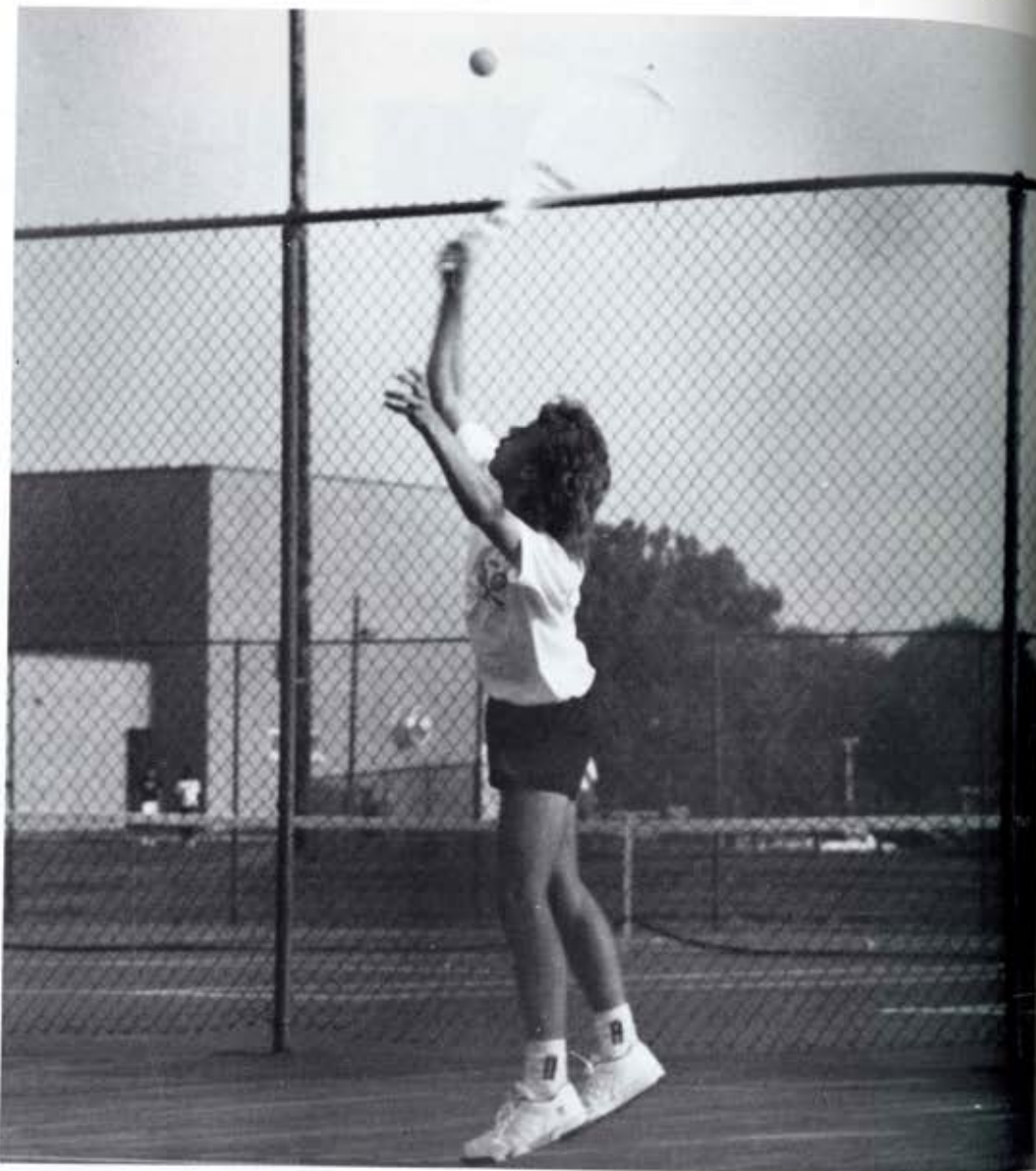

girls' team.

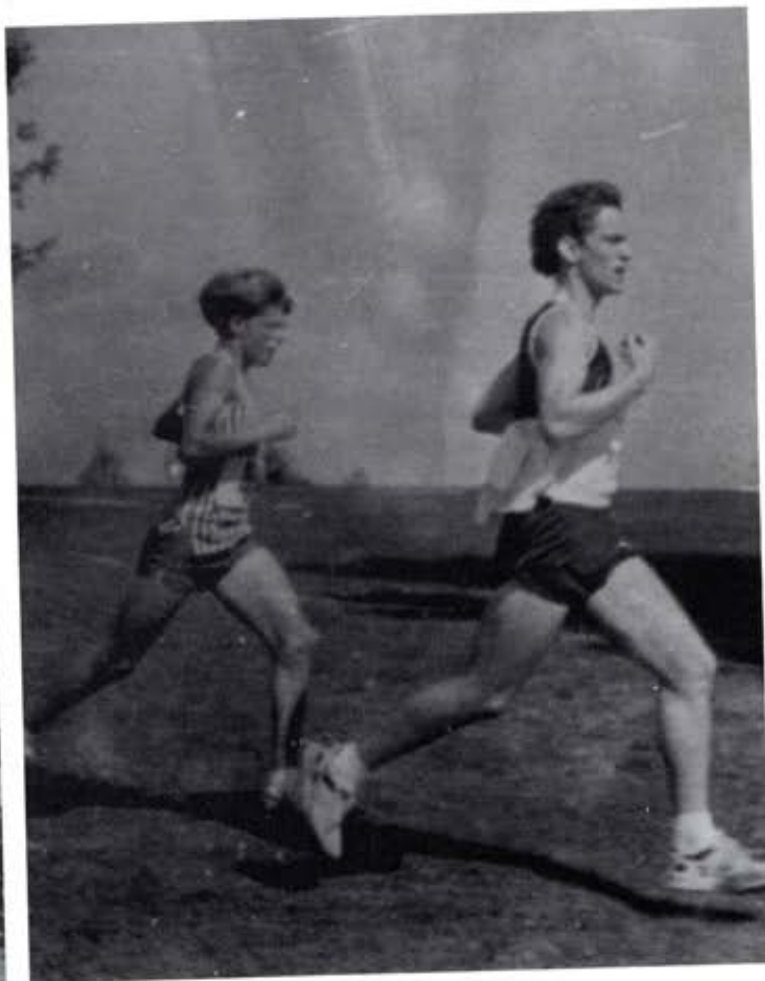

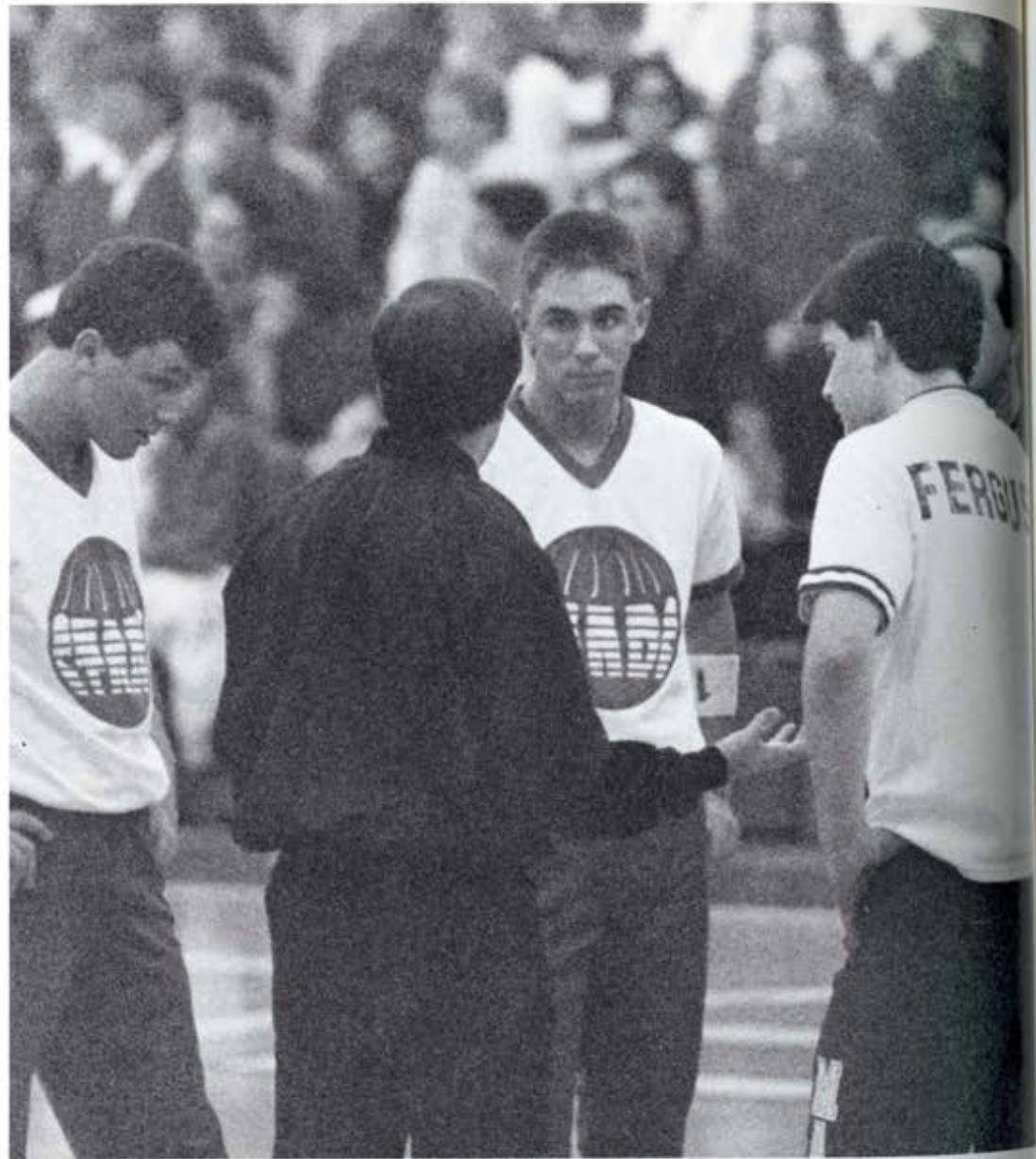

# CUBS PLAY WITH PRIDE AND DETERMINATION

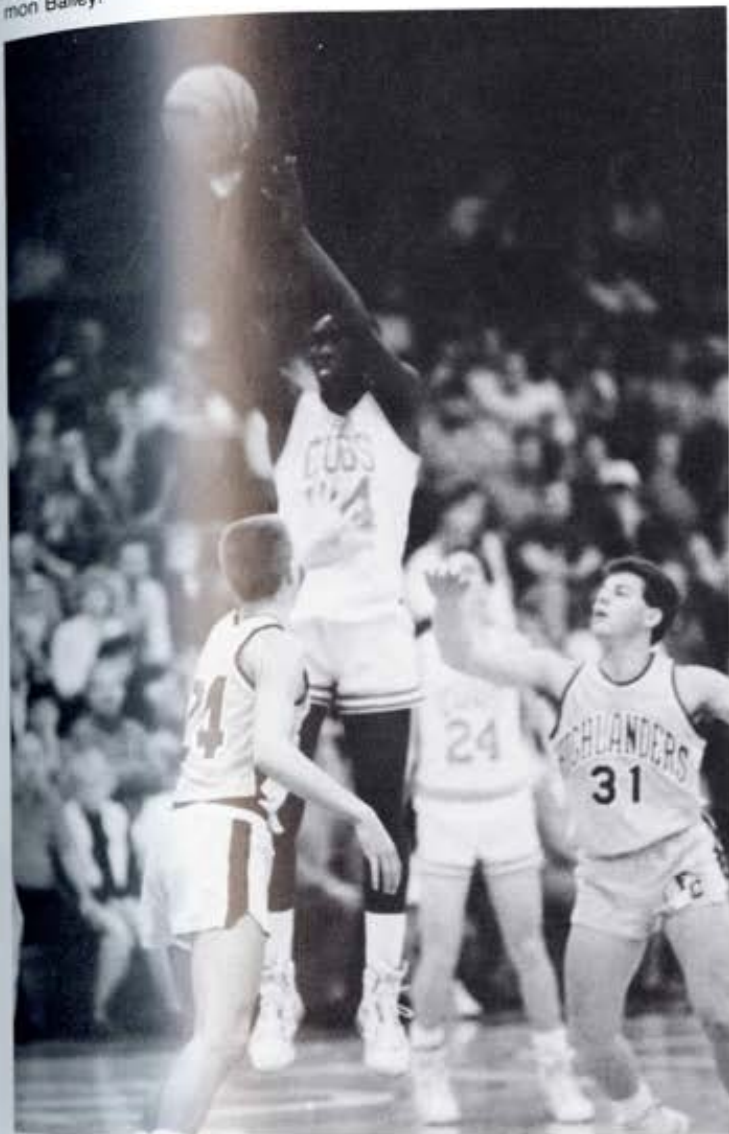

year." Juniors Mike Kemper, Reese Lee, and Chad Imel did an excellent job for the team this year.

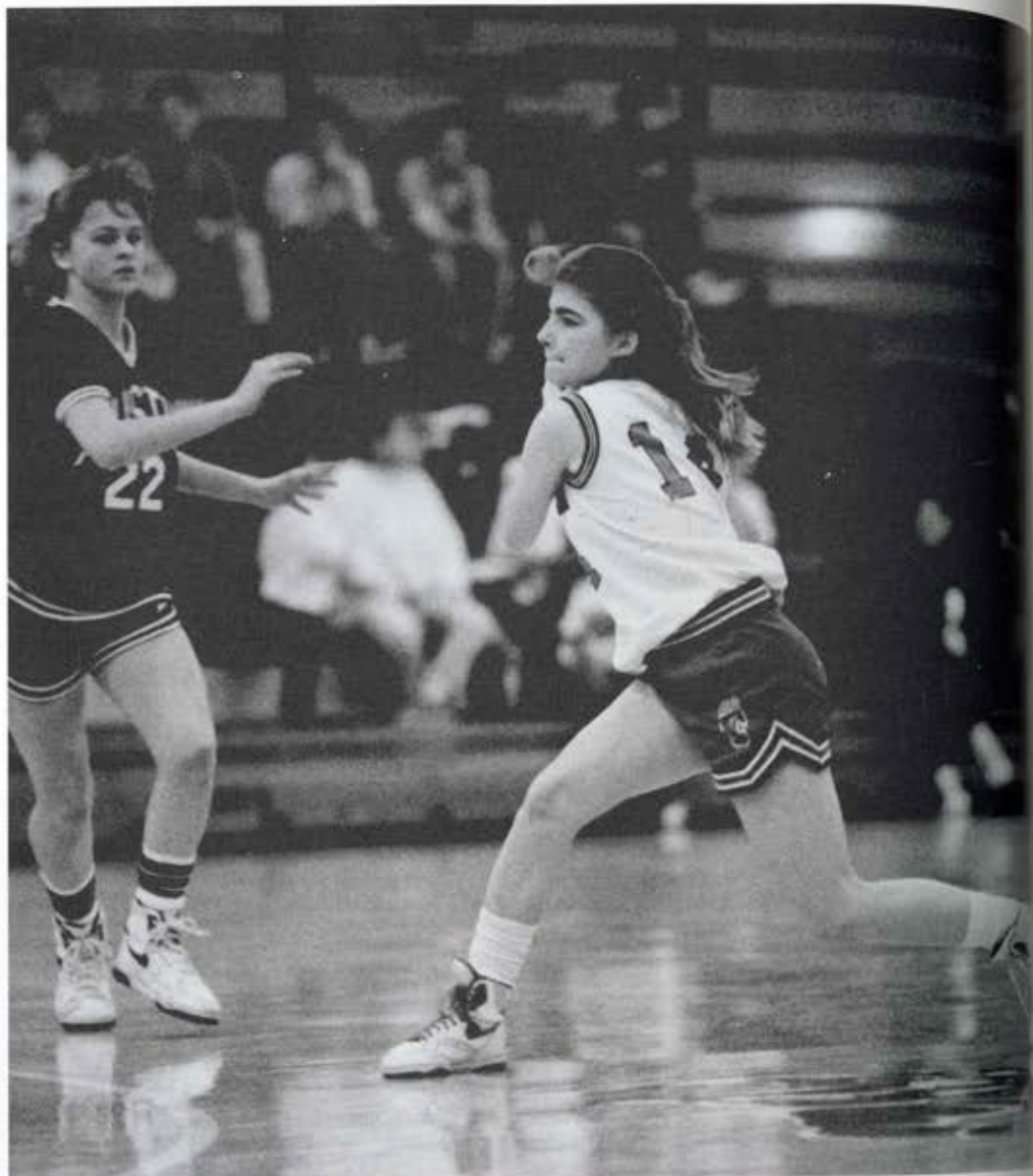

Shawna Cook received Most Valuable Player at this year's awards banquet along with the Most Assists Award. Christi Fer-

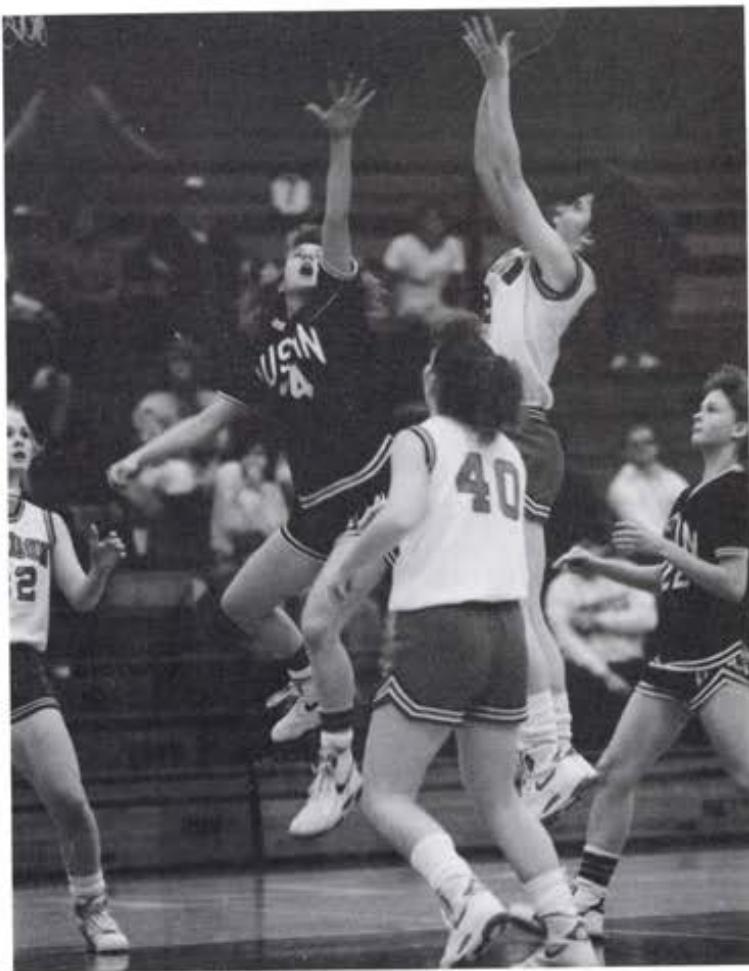

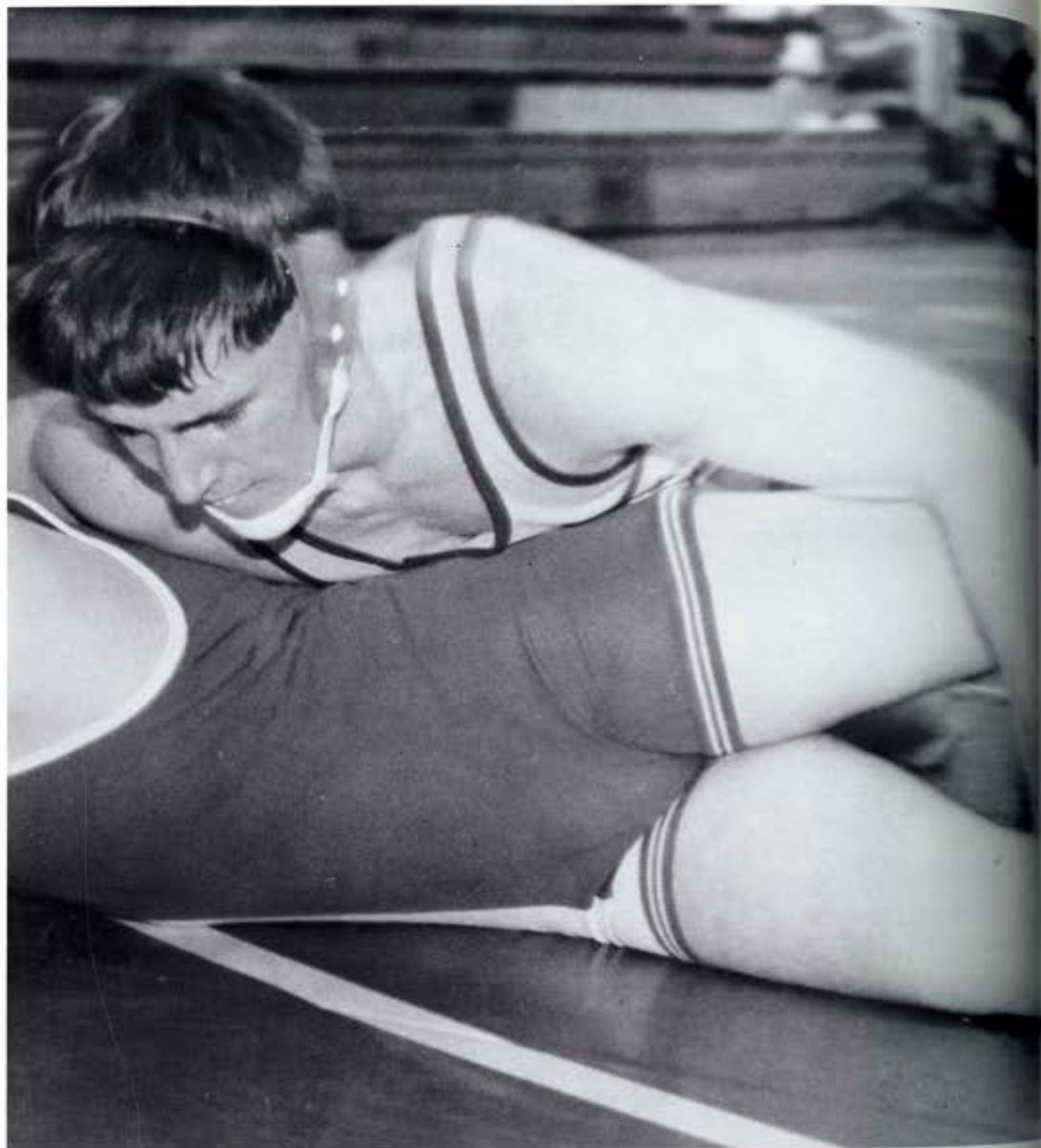

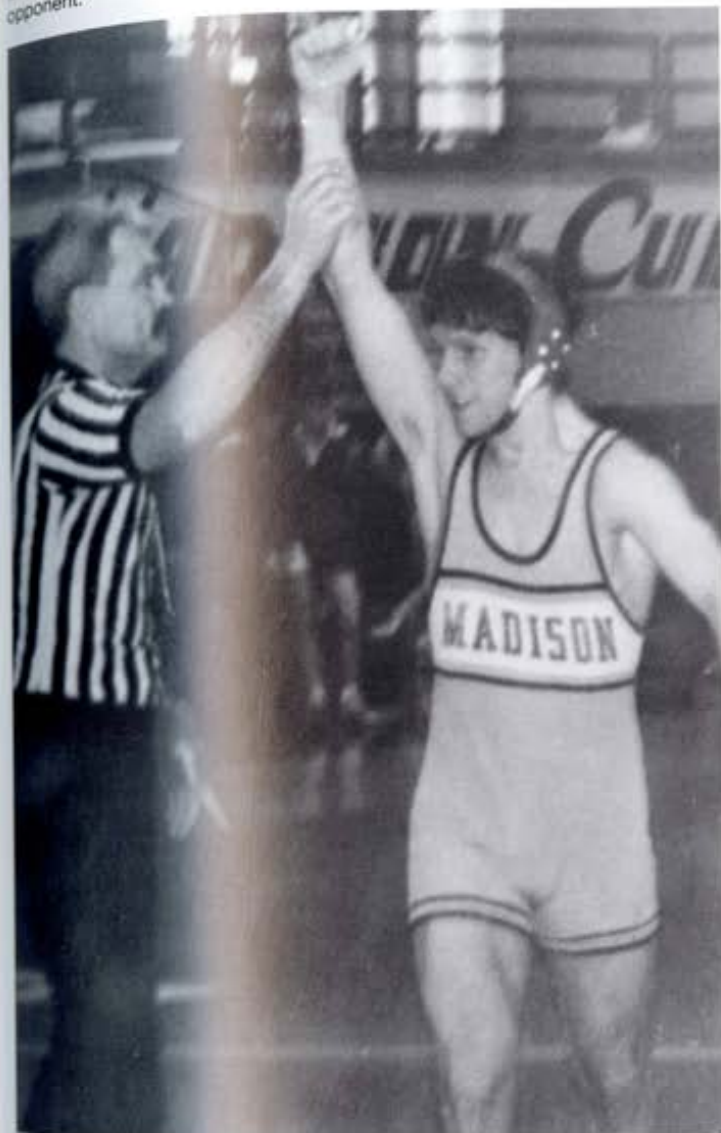

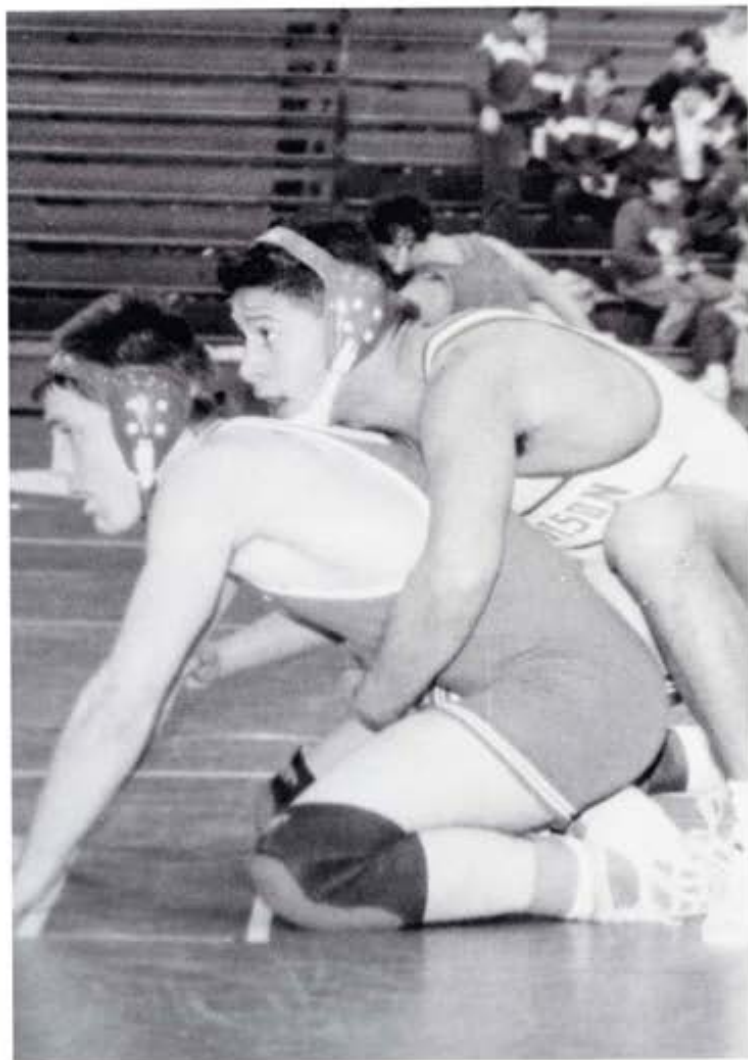
## Looking Victorious

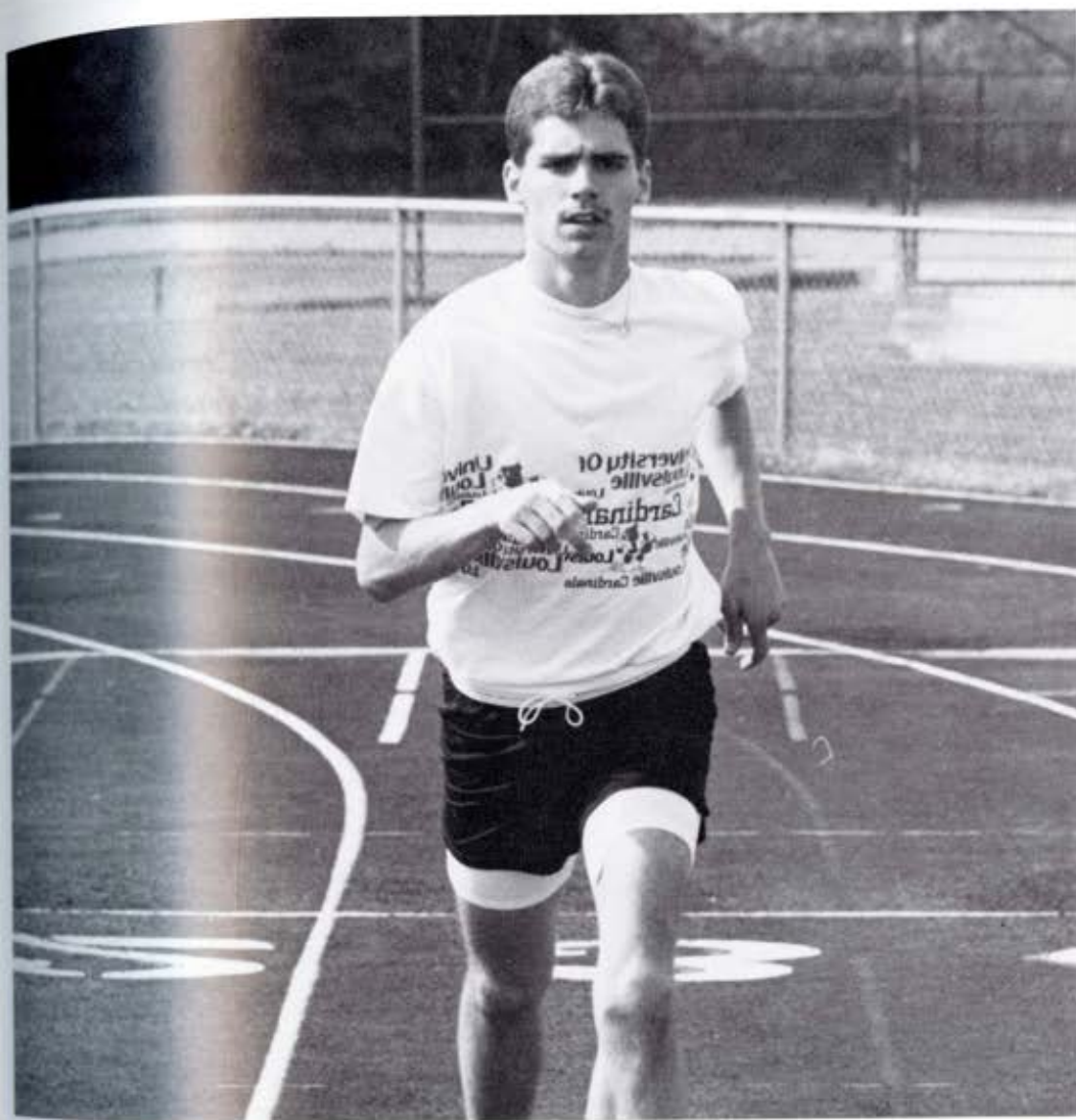

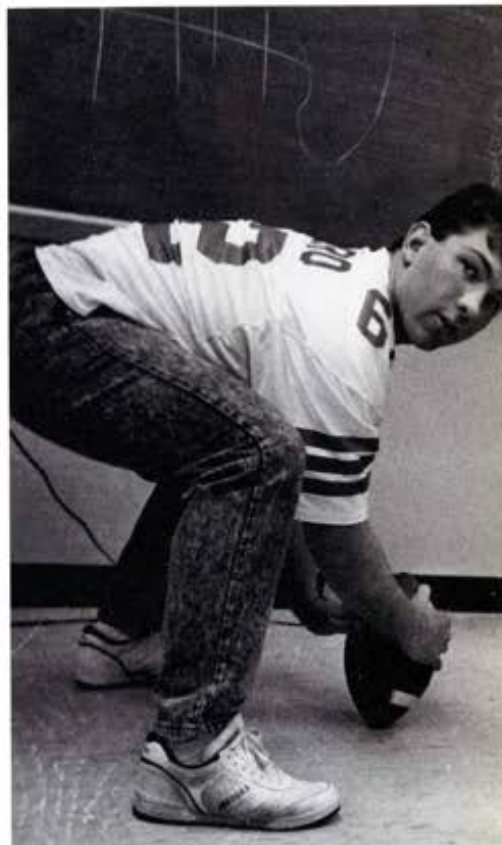
The map of the United States shows the areas where the four students will attend school.

*To me, Roger was not only a best friend and someone I saw daily in the hallways, he was my only brother.*

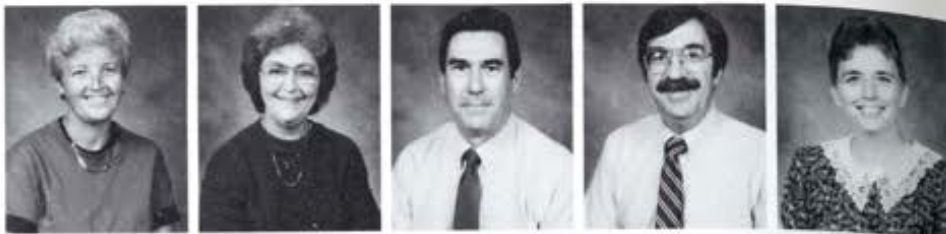
