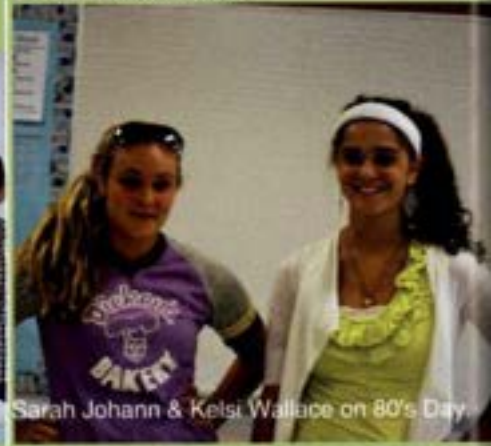

Tuesday sent us off with 80s Day, with some looking like they should have been in the film *Flashdance*.

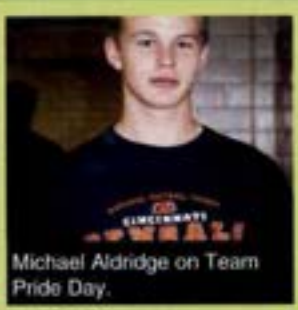
From there, Wednesday gave us Team Pride Day where people wore their favorite team shirt or jersey, like the Colts or The Cincinnati Bengals.

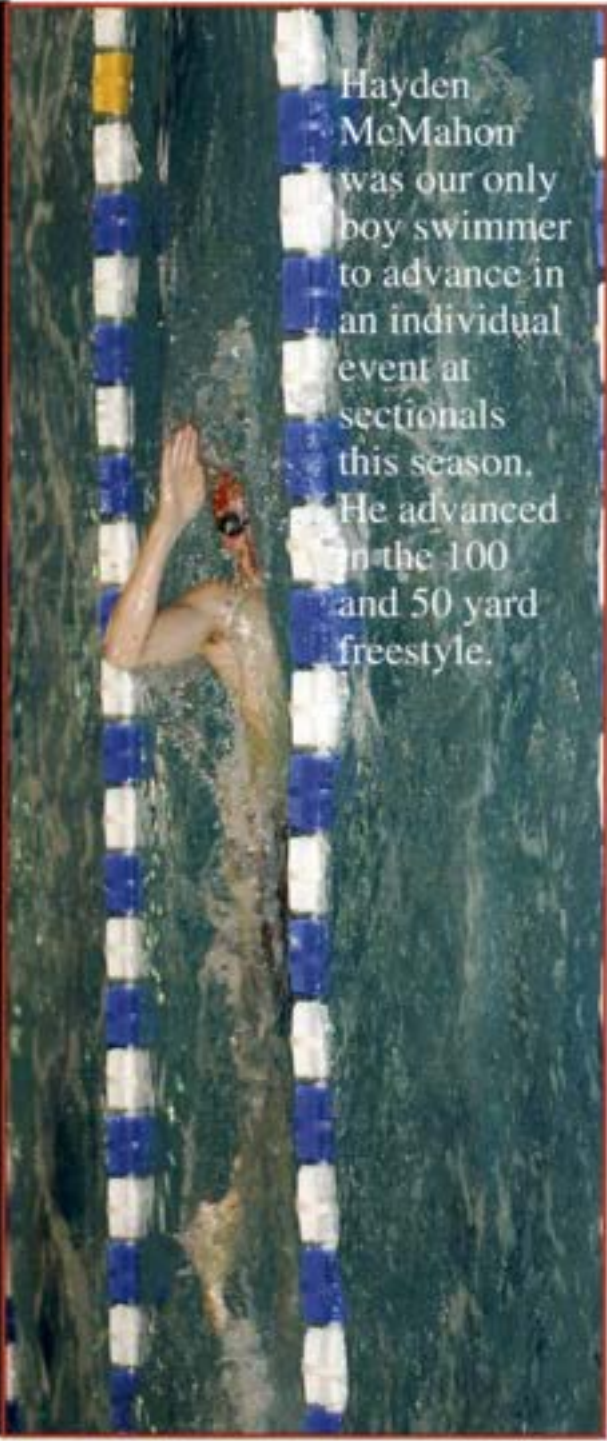

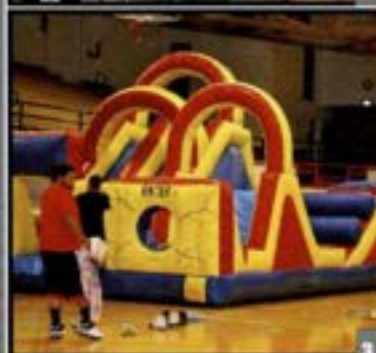

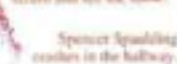
