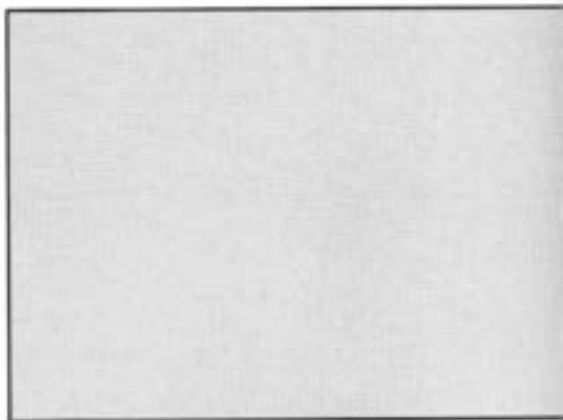

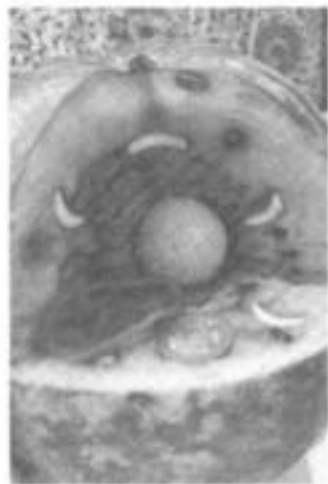
History is a little off the beaten path, where doing projects, essays, and the ever-present report are looked forward to with joy for some and dread for most others.

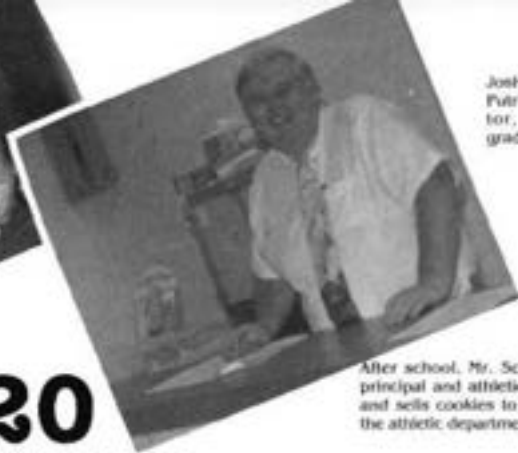
