The Future Farmers of America is a national organization of farm boys regularly entolled in vocational ag. riculture in high school. Because of the close correlation with the work in vocational agriculture, it is in-tra-curricular rather than extra-curricular.

The organization originated in 1928 and is now found in every state in the Union, also, in Puerto Rico. The chapter at Southwestern was chartered in the fall of 1950.

There are four degrees members may earn in the FFA: Greenhand, Chapter Farmer, State Hoosler Farmer and American Farmer. Two bonorary chapter degrees are awarded each year.

The colors of the FFA are Corn Gold and National Blve; these colors are rich and cheerful and have become a symbol of friendiness, cooperation and leadership.

The motto consists of only four lines, but these reflect a spirit and sincerity that shows the true view point of farm youth, "the backbone of a nation." The motto is as follows:
