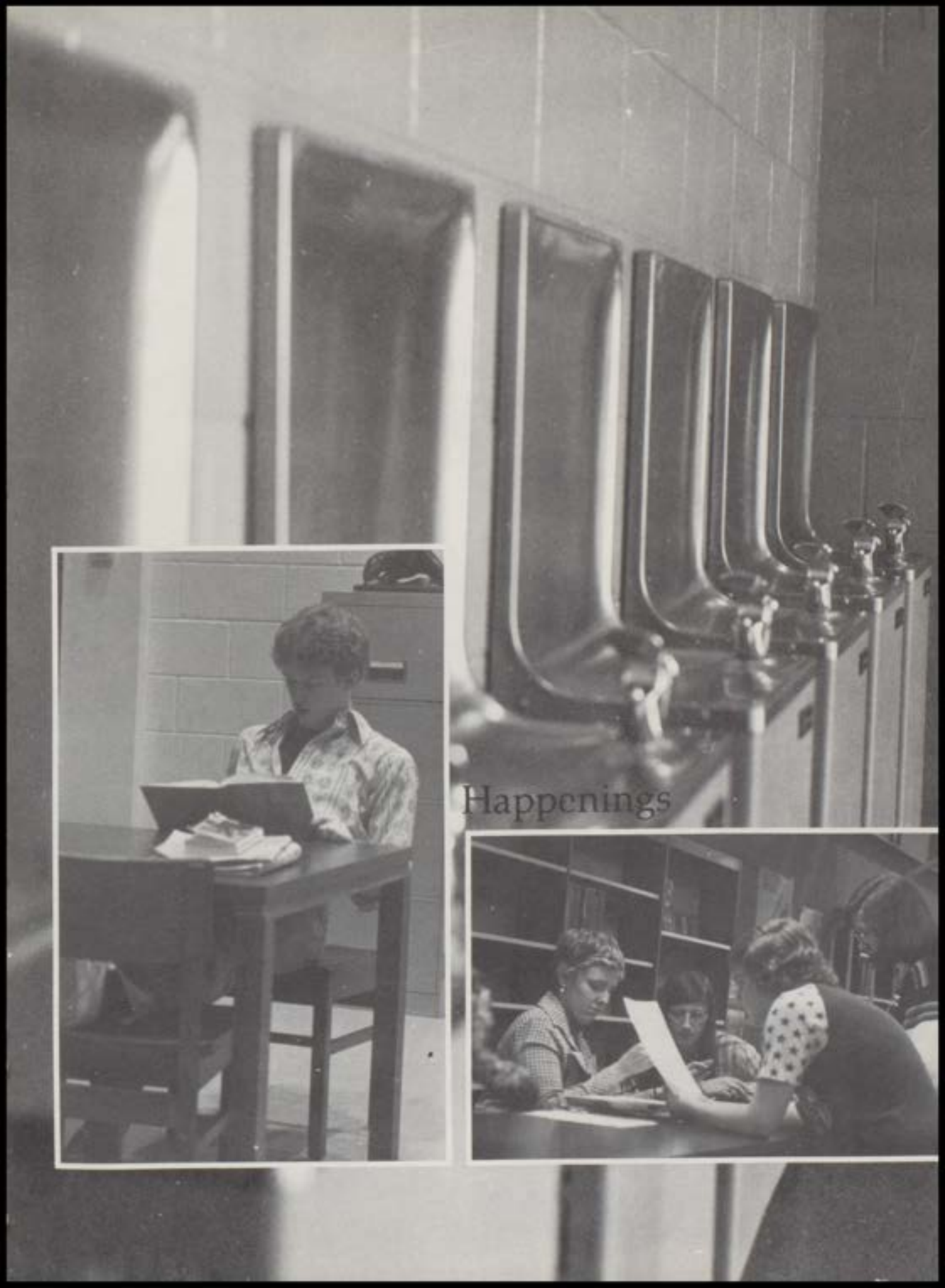

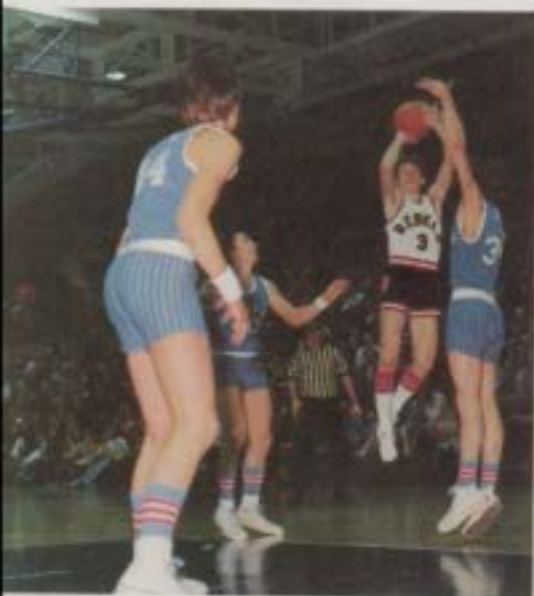


## Janet Crowned Queen

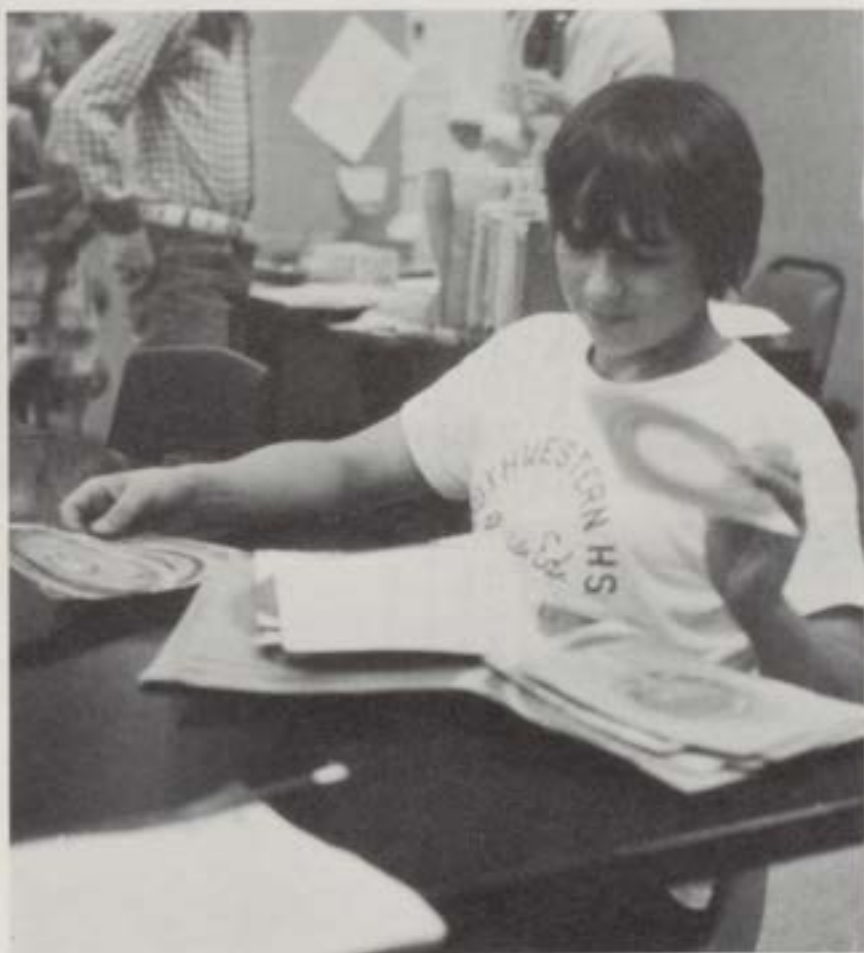


# New Building Gives Jr. High Life Different Perspective

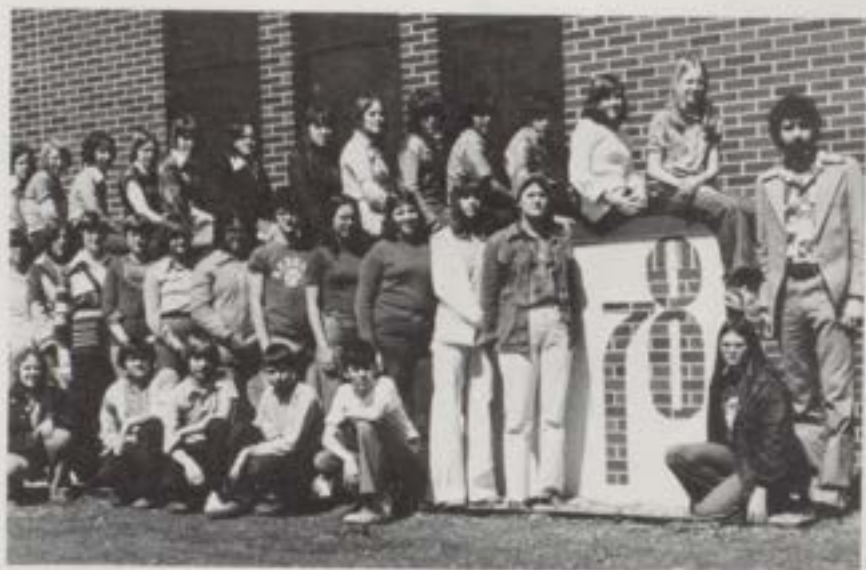

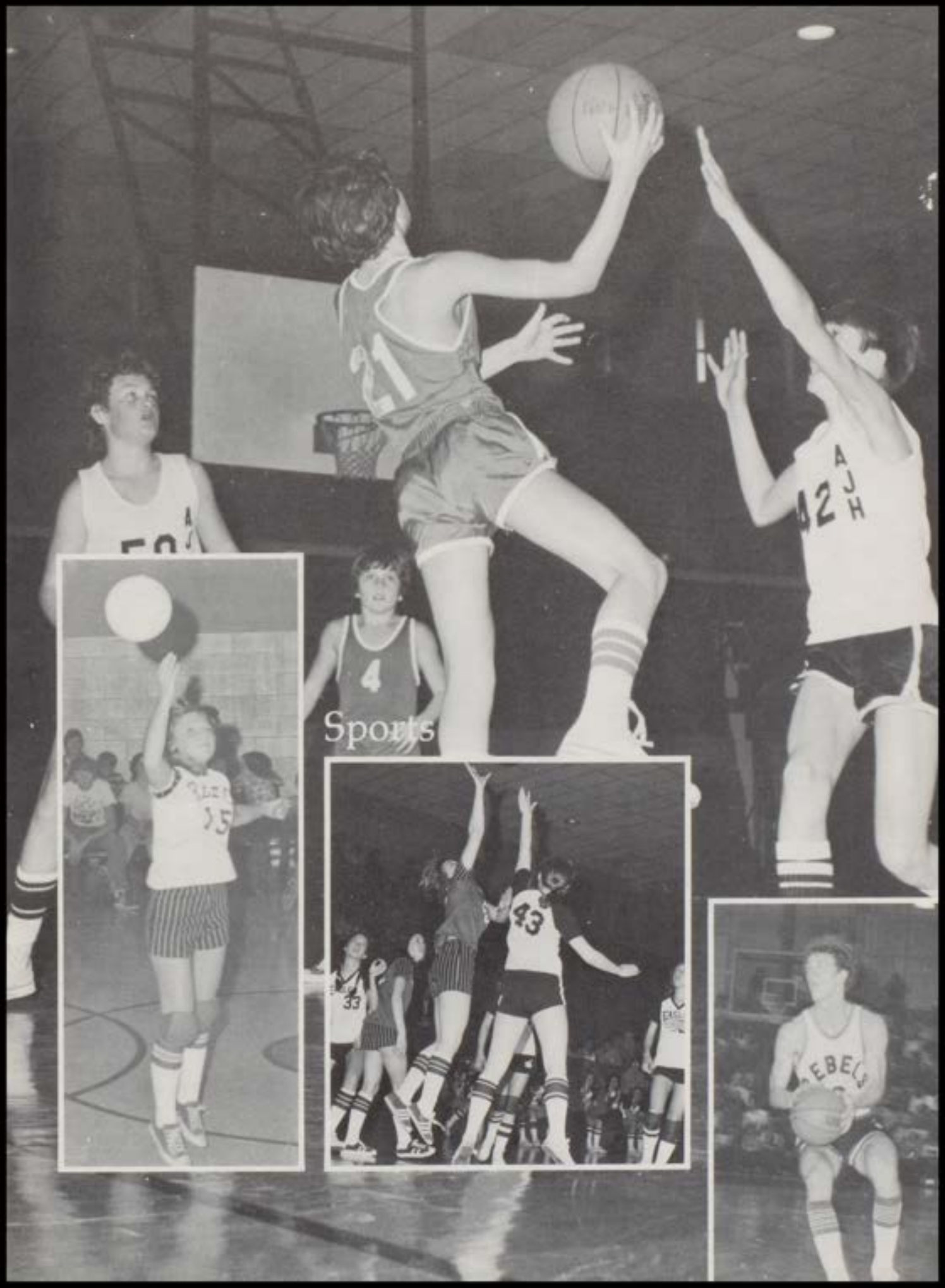


## The Ones That Put It All Together

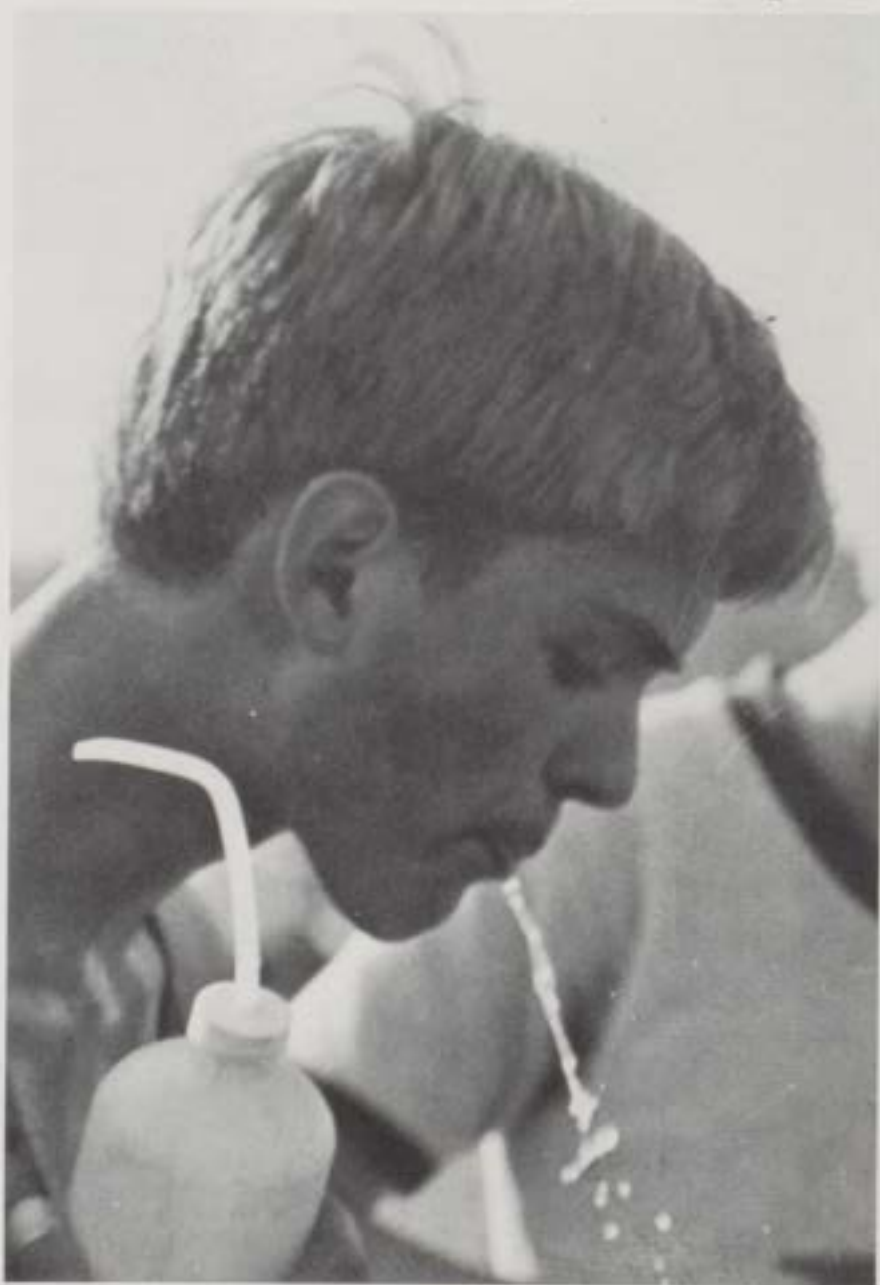

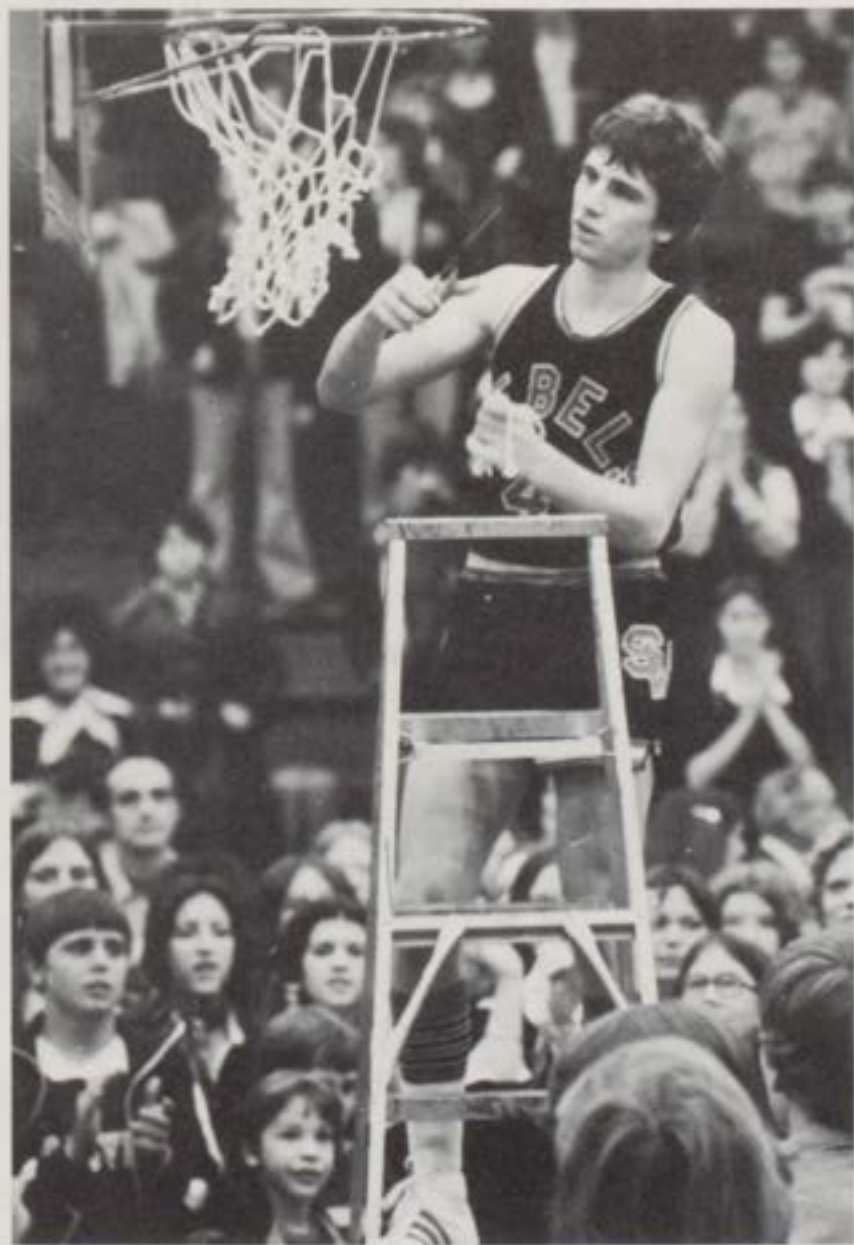

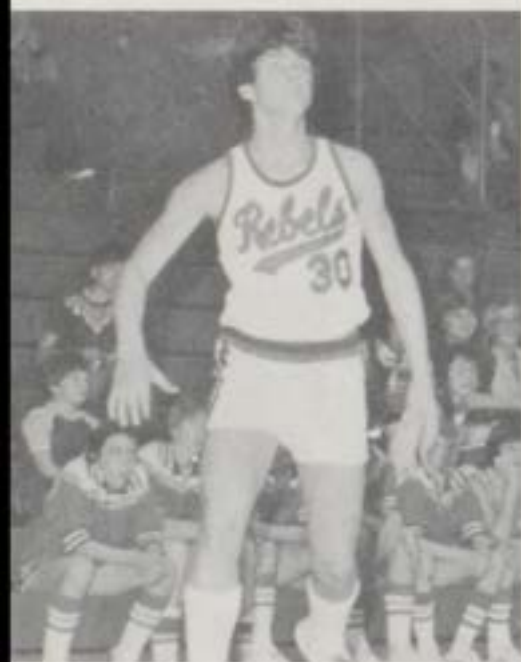

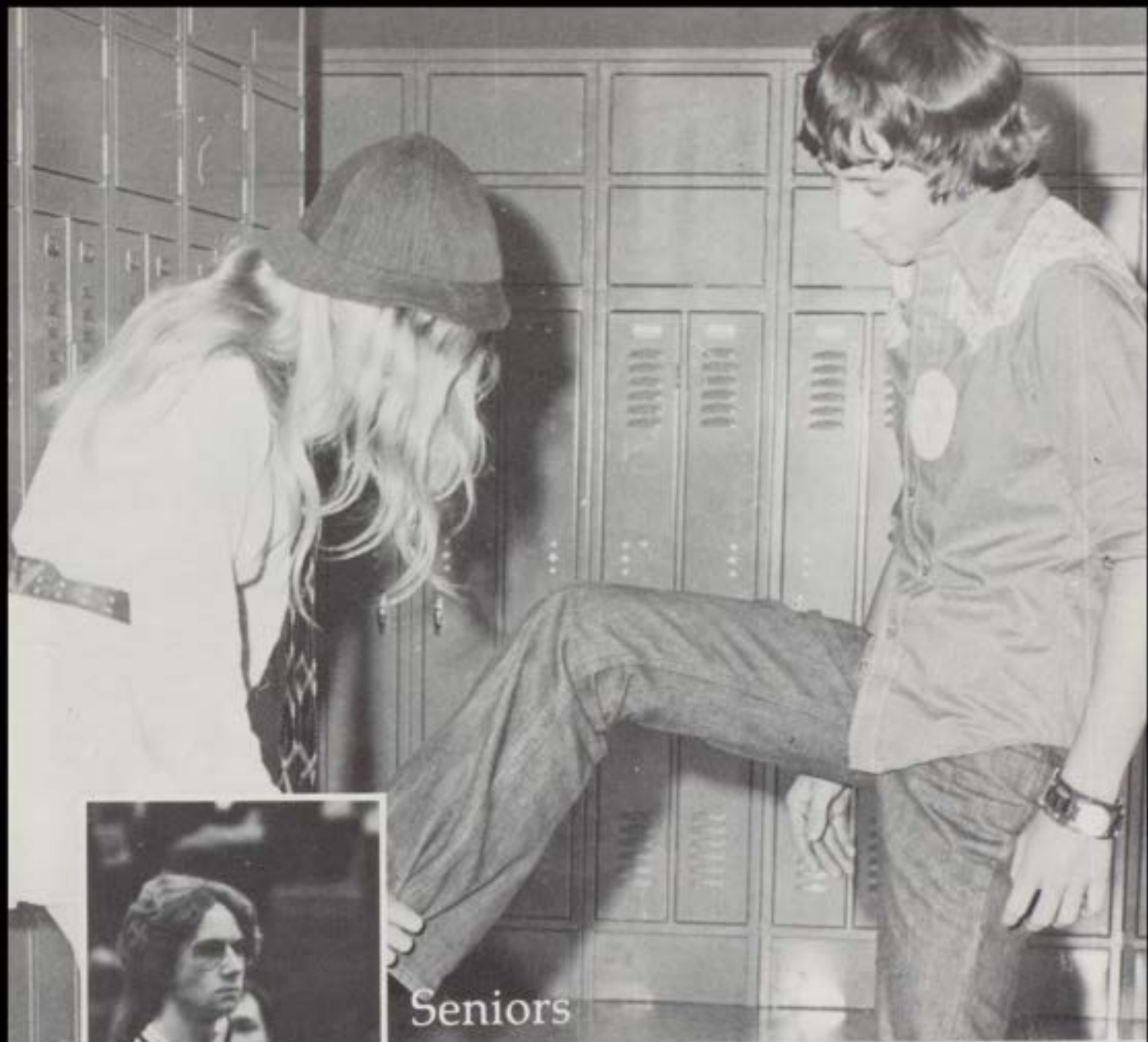
