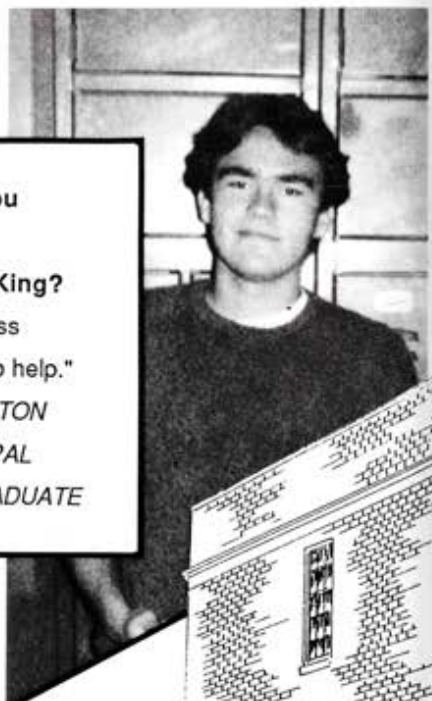
The Early Days...

Southwestern Jefferson County School Corporation resulted from the consolidation of four township schools: Hanover, Saluda, Republican, and Smyrna. The school opened in the fall of 1960, occupying the facilities of what formerly had been Hanover High School.

Students from Saluda and Hanover High Schools became Southwestern students, playing their games in a gym which resembled an airplane hangar and holding track meets at Hanover College. A wide variety of after-school activities were offered to students in the new school and enthusiasm for these as well as academics and athletics was widespread.

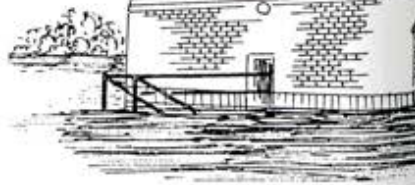
The very first *Rebian* editor, Linda Underwood Firth recalled those early days: "Even though Southwestern had consolidated in 1959, students didn't come from Saluda High School until 1961. In fact, my senior year (1961) was when we changed school colors and mascots."


Mrs. Firth, who after college returned to Southwestern as an elementary teacher and has since taught many SW graduates, remembered that her senior class almost adopted the mascot *Cavaliers*, but instead opted for the name of *Rebels*. The combination of the Saluda H.S. *Lions'* red and white and the Hanover H.S. *Bulldogs'* blue and white were established as the new school's colors.

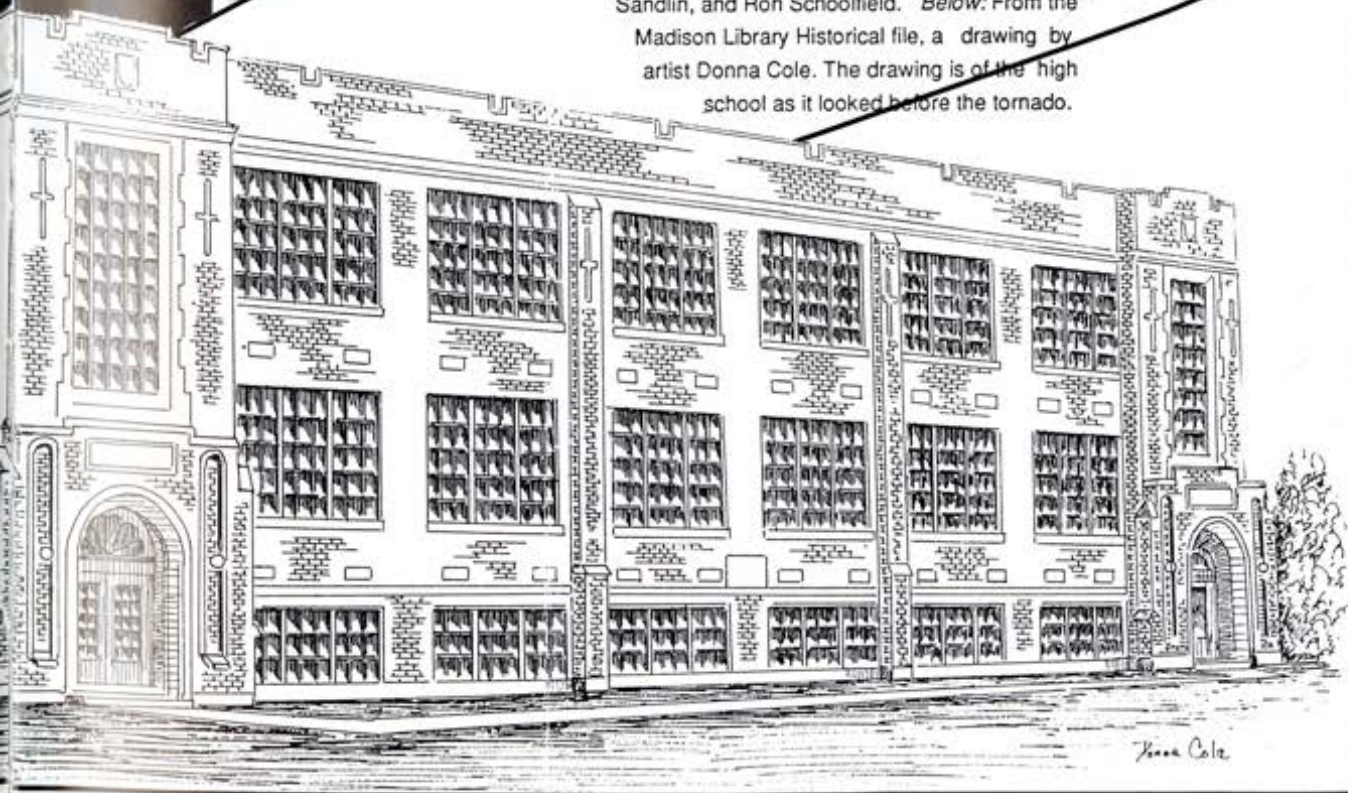

Rebuilding...

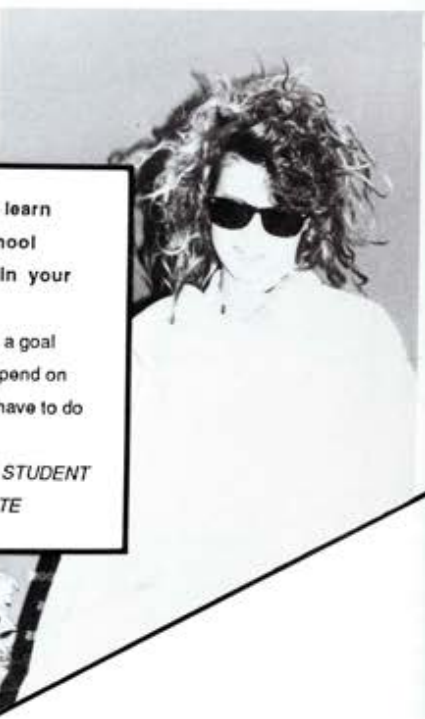
While history records the '60s as a time of change, it was not until the early '70s that Southwestern, like other public schools at the time, saw some changes in policy. The school dress code was relaxed in 1971. Boys could wear long hair, girls could wear pants, and the "anything goes" idea which had crept into fashion became a bit more apparent at SW.


But fashion was the last thing on the minds of Southwesterners in the spring of 1974 after tornadoes on April 3rd that year left the school and many homes in the surrounding community damaged beyond repair. The high school was reduced to a large pile of rubble with little left standing of the gym as well. Classes were suspended for the rest of the year, and when the school year began again that fall, students found themselves learning in small, portable classrooms while the new high school and gym remained under construction.

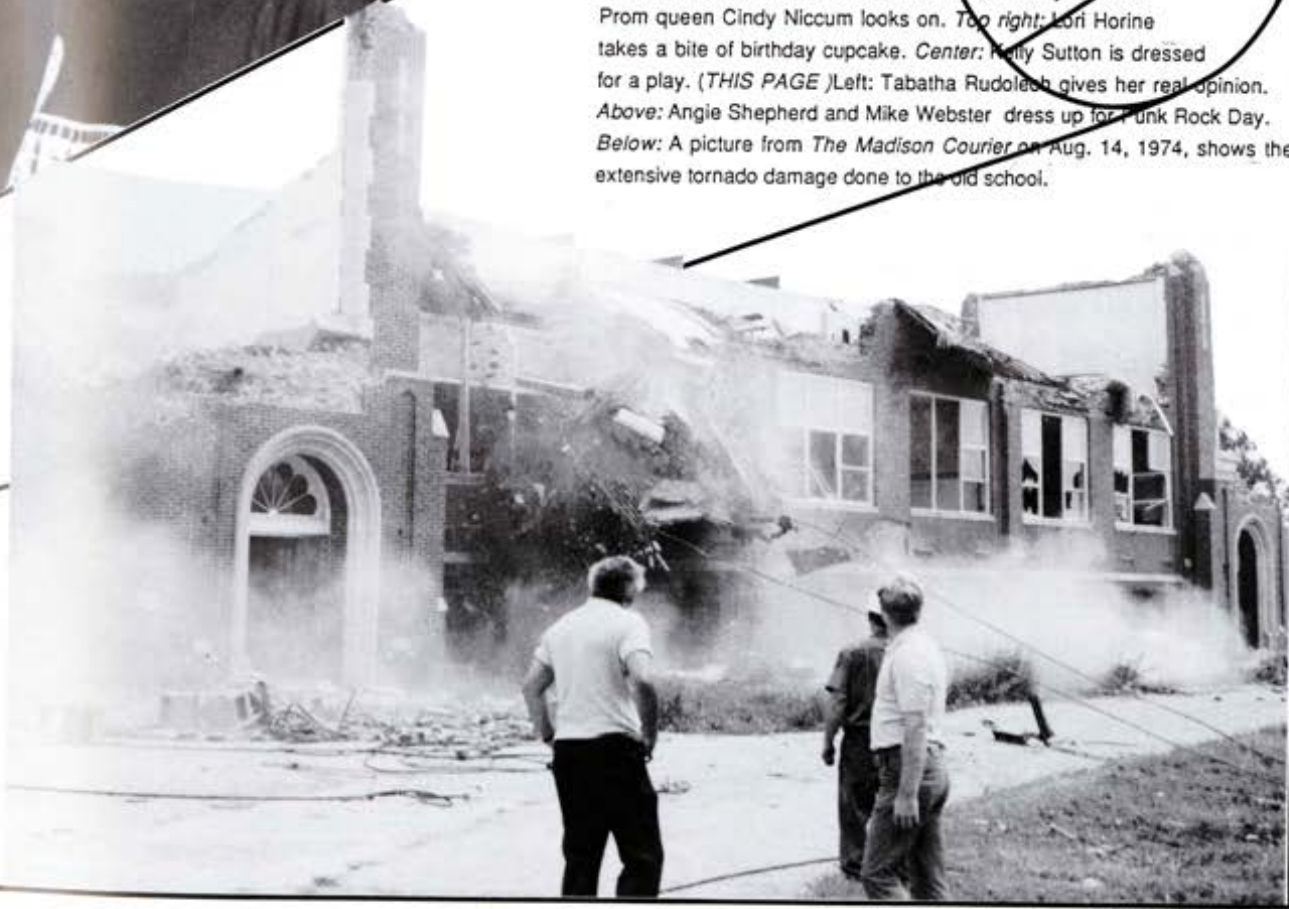

However, by the fall of 1975 Southwestern students were moved into the new school and soon became used to the sounds of construction as workmen continued their rebuilding tasks. By early winter the high school was completed; the junior high and gym were finished in 1976.

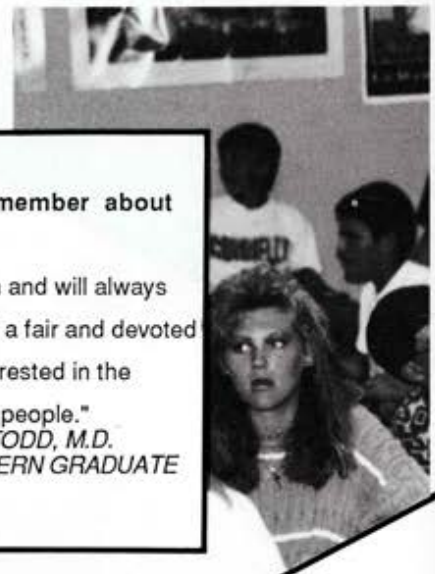
The tornadoes of 1974 transformed the look of the school campus, but the enthusiasm of the students continued to reflect a belief in performing to the best of one's abilities. Two boys' basketball sectional championships were earned by Southwestern in 1973 and 1974 under the leadership of Steve Collier, Indiana's co-Mr. Basketball in 1974.

As the '80s arrived, Southwestern Jr./Sr. High School added another addition for the pursuit of fine arts and vocational arts. The high-tech age was upon everyone, and the school's third decade was marked by the acquisition of classroom computers.

It was also marked by changes in lifestyle which saw more and more students taking after-school jobs in order to face many adult responsibilities at an earlier age. Some SW students traded the chance to participate in after-school activities for the opportunity to own a car.

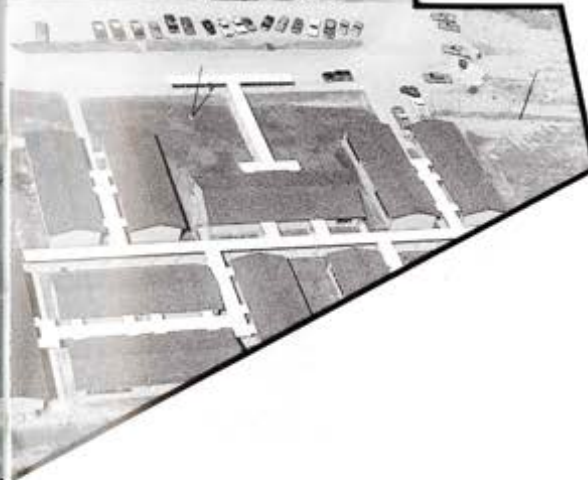
However, many students found a way to budget their time; academics and activities continued to prosper at SWJH-HS. A computer club was established, and students began organizing teams to compete in various interscholastic academic competitions. Another boys' basketball sectional crown was won in 1987, and girls' sports teams grew.

While many persons came and went at Southwestern, one person stayed and worked for the progress made in the last thirty years. On May 20, 1990, the Southwestern High School Gym became the Delbert O. King Gymnasium to honor the long and loyal service of its principal. Alumni, faculty, students, and friends of the school system participated in a ceremony which marked the beginning of the school's fourth decade with a fond remembrance of its past.

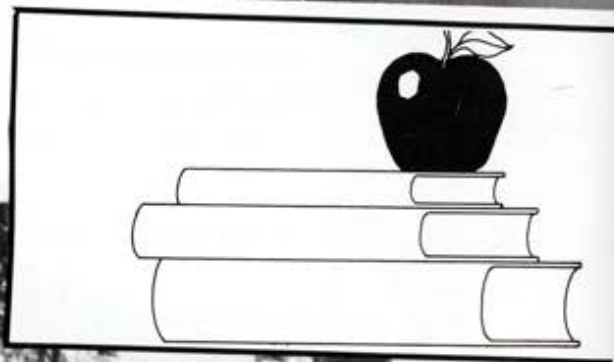

All Those Long Hours Pay Off in the End

During the 1989-1990 school year, eight teachers in the SWJH-HS English department spent the year reorganizing the English department curriculum and reviewing textbooks for adoption beginning the 1990-91 school year. The group was under the leadership of chairperson Mrs. Virgie Dowell. The English teachers met weekly most of the year in order to revise the language arts agreements to teach for grades 7-12 at Southwestern. This revision was last completed in 1984 and the process coincides with mandatory language arts textbooks adoption in Indiana. For adoption the group decided to recommend to the school board The Houghton Mifflin series and the Adventures for Readers series by Harcourt Brace Jovanich.

The math department consisted of eight teachers in the junior and senior high who taught a variety of courses. Mrs. Terah Woolbright taught consumer, general, and advanced math. Mr. Joe Barnett taught Algebra 1 & 2. Mrs. Barbara Ellefsen, the computer teacher, also taught one advanced math class. The other five teachers were Mr. Al Eckert, Mrs. Mary Wilson, Mrs. Carolyn King, Mrs. Mary Hammond, and Mr. Bill Finnegan.

Newspaper & Yearbook Cover Day-to-day Events

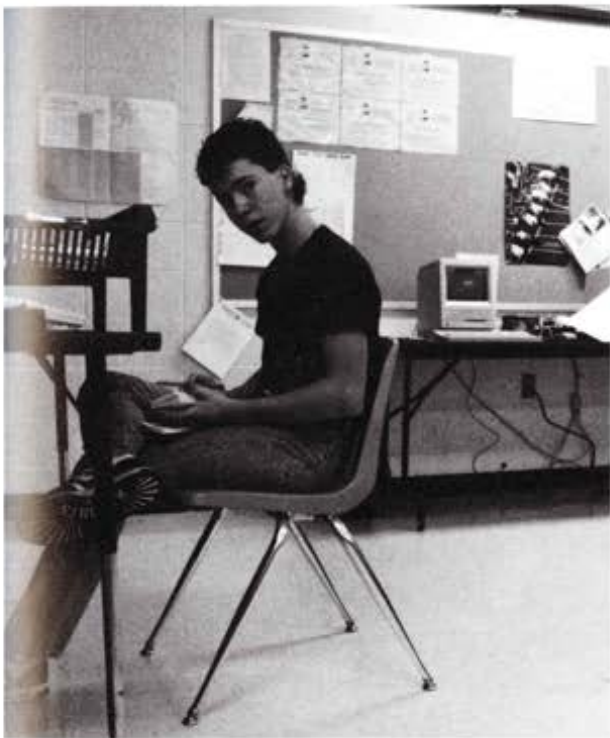

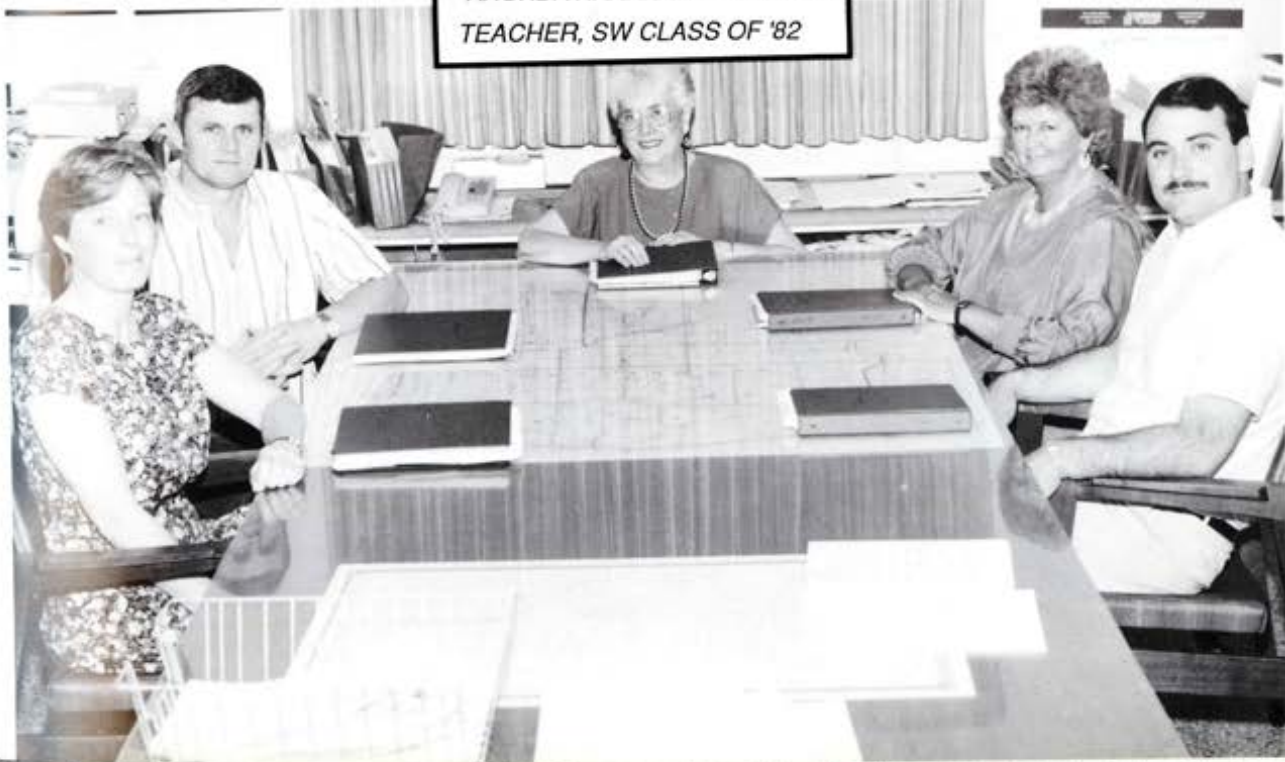

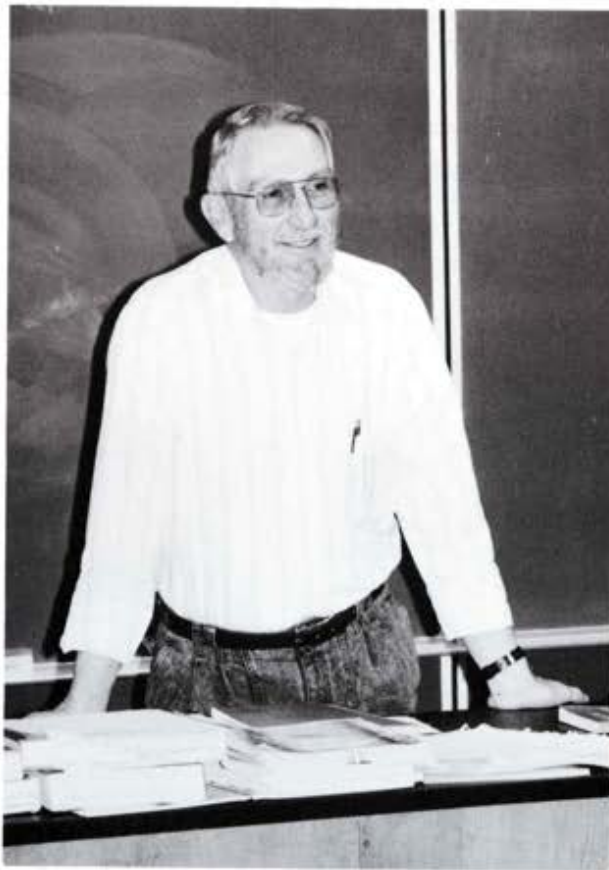
SW says good-bye to retiring

This year Southwestern said good-bye to four excellent teachers who have served the school well. The Barnetts and the Finnegans retired at the end of the 1989-90 school year. Each teacher — Mrs. Mary Sue Barnett, Mr. Joe Barnett, Mr. Bill Finnegan, and Mrs. Marlyn Finnegan — has taught for at least 25 years at Southwestern.

After leaving the SW school system, Mrs. Barnett plans to do a lot of traveling and relaxing. Mr. Barnett plans to work in the real estate business. Farming and taking it easy are on the agenda

mentioned it wasn't any harder or easier on him, but it was harder on Jeff. Teachers who have their own children in class tend to expect more from them than they do from other students, he noted.

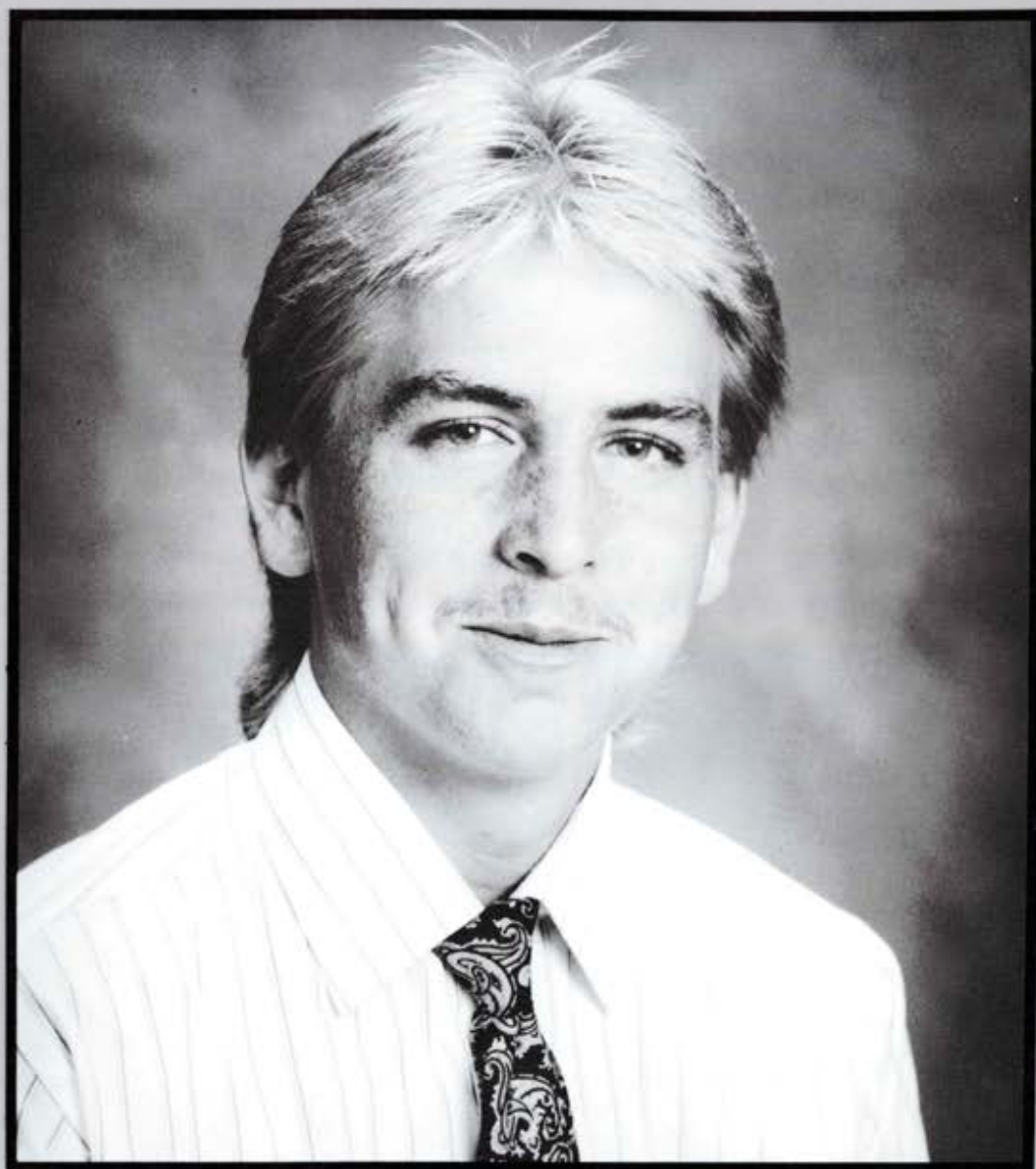

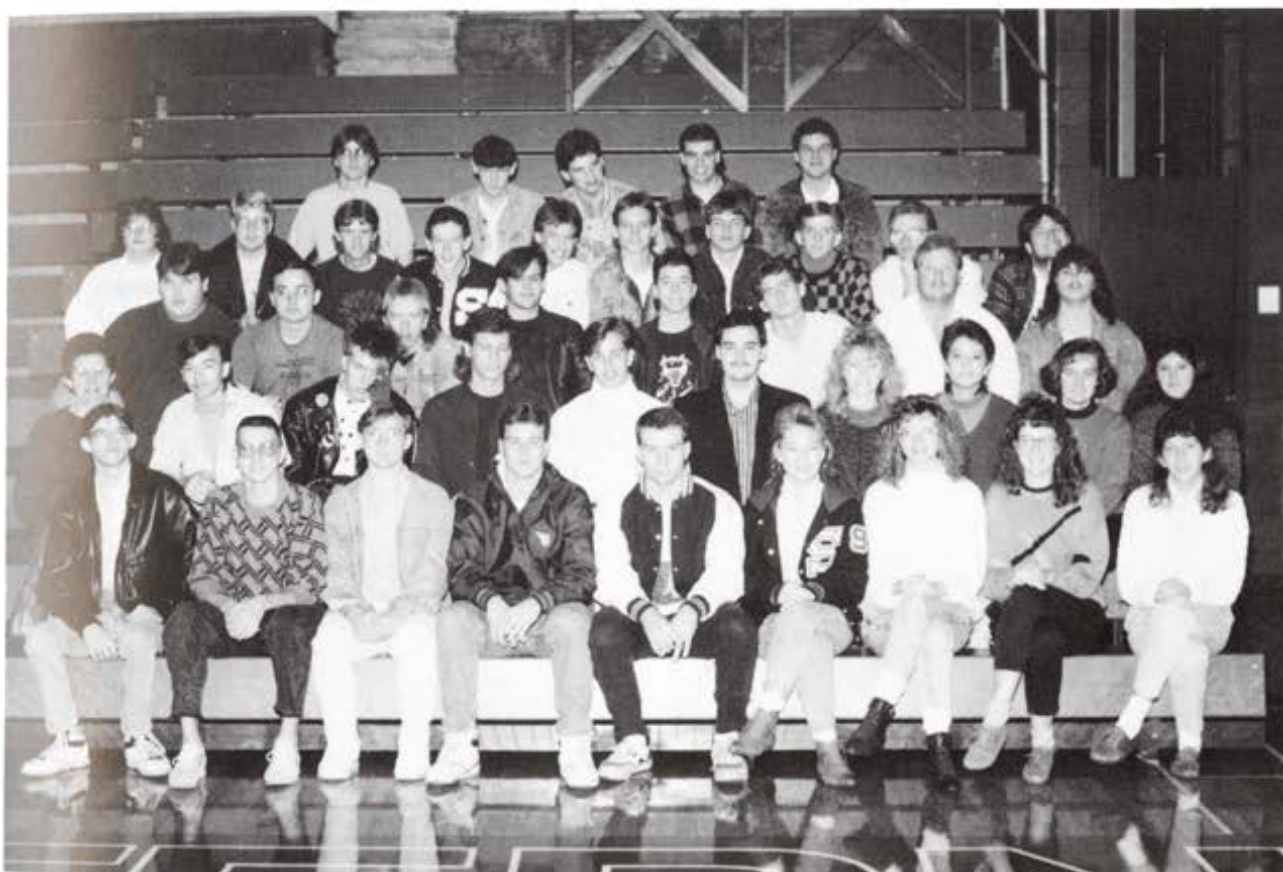

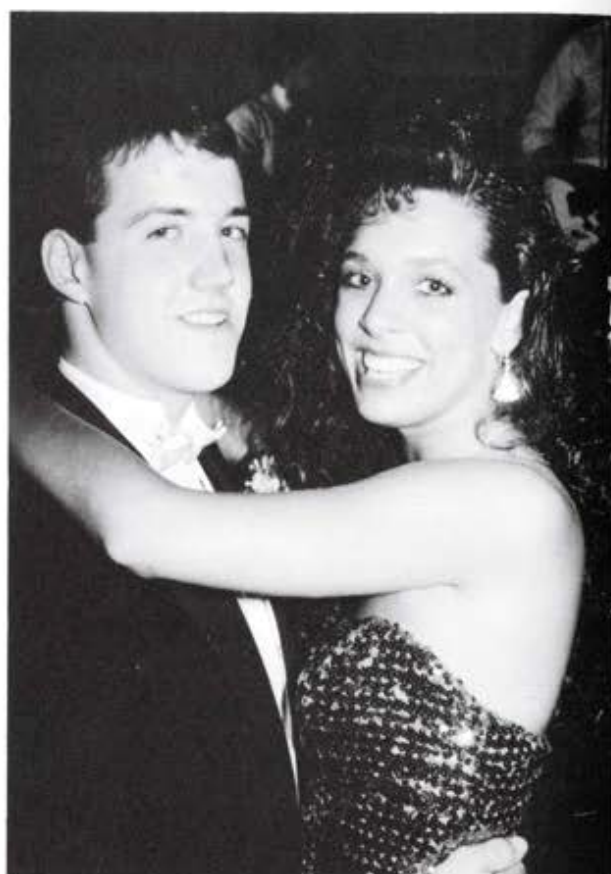

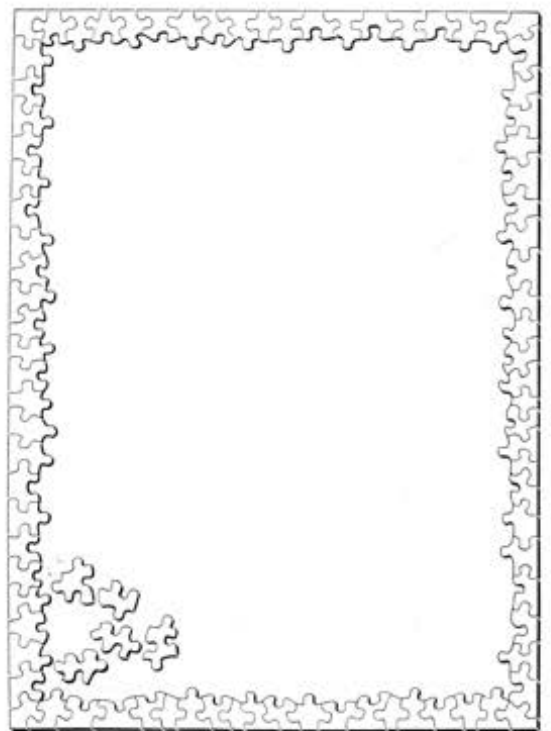

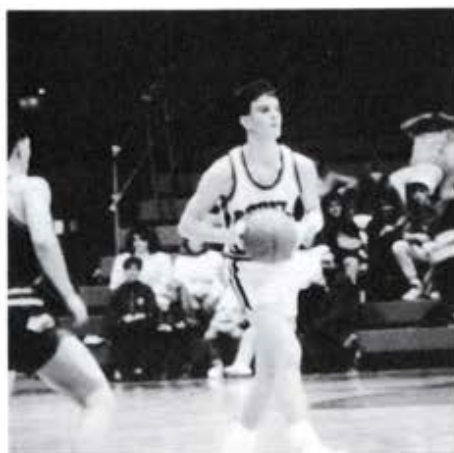

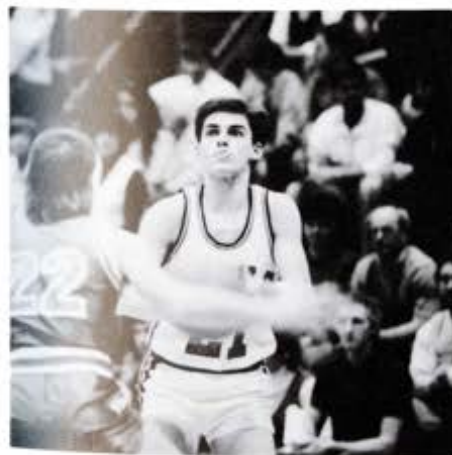

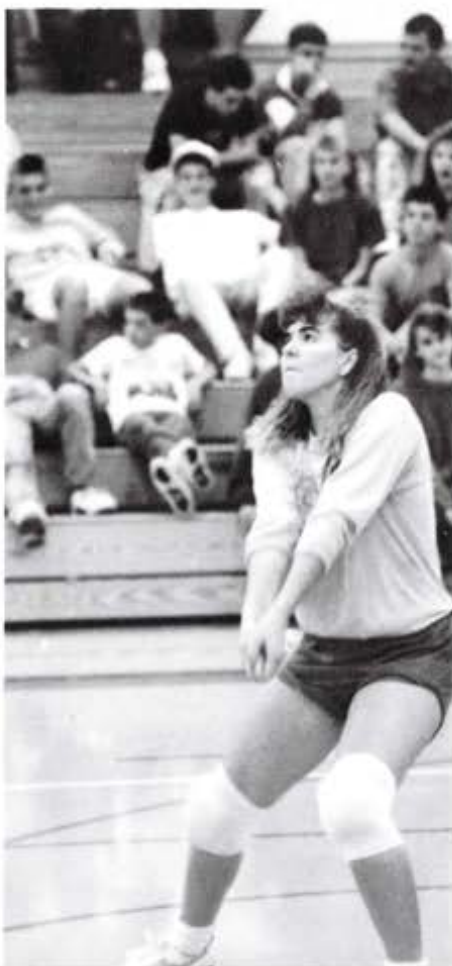

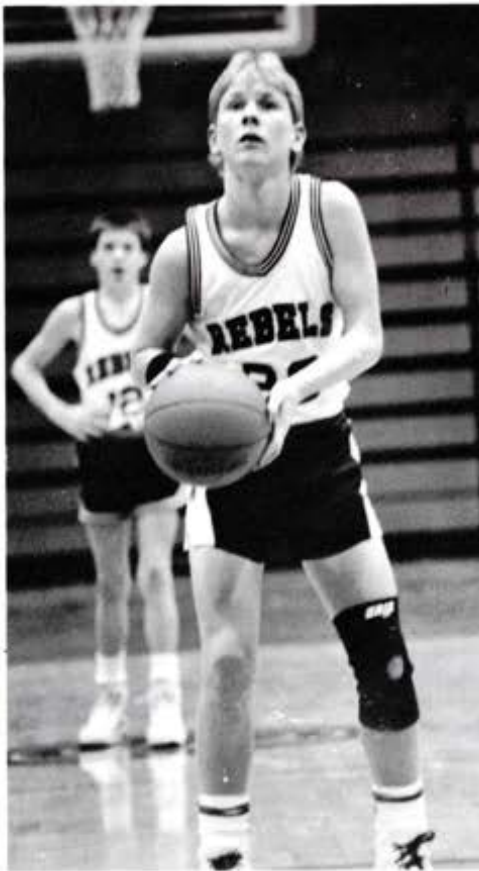

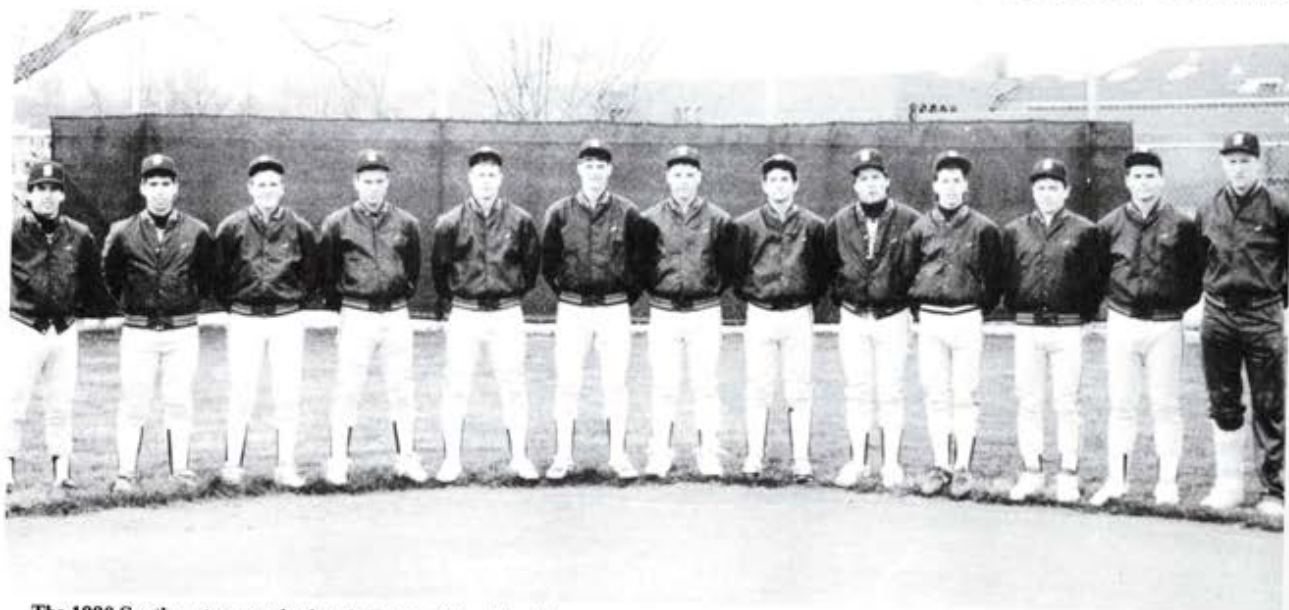
Also at Ball State they had three Spirit Sticks that were passed out for the schools who had the most spirit all day, and SWHS received one of those three.

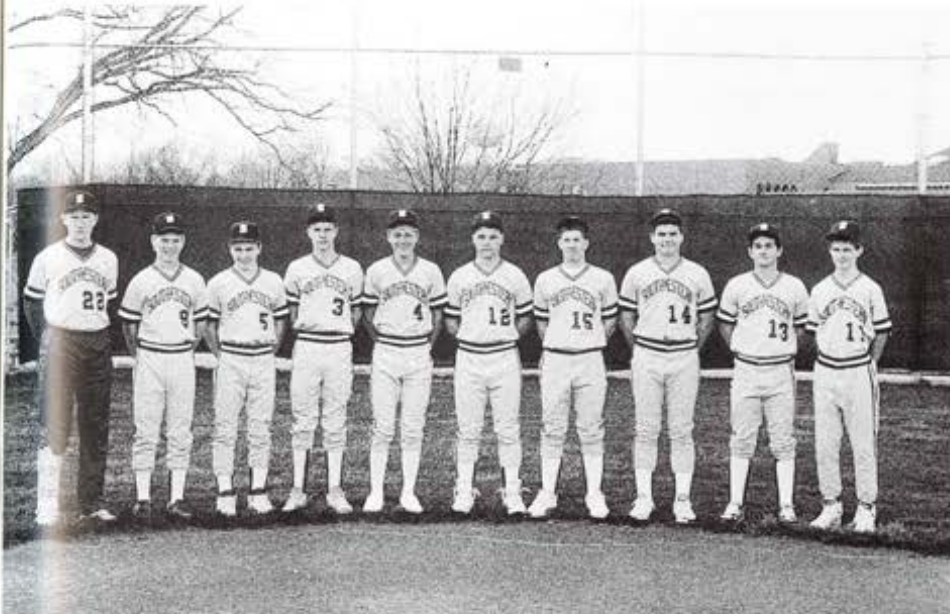

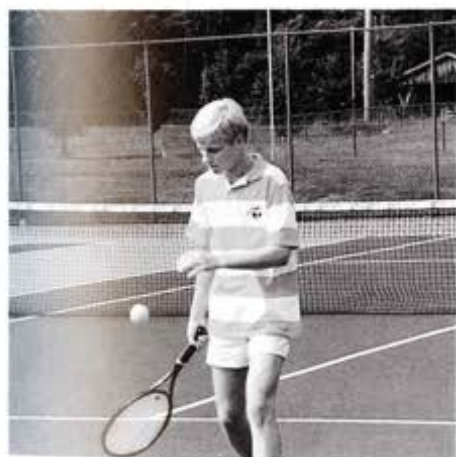

Due to the fact the Rebels were young, they ended up with a record of five and eleven, but the players showed the team was tough and a team to be reckoned with for a couple of years.

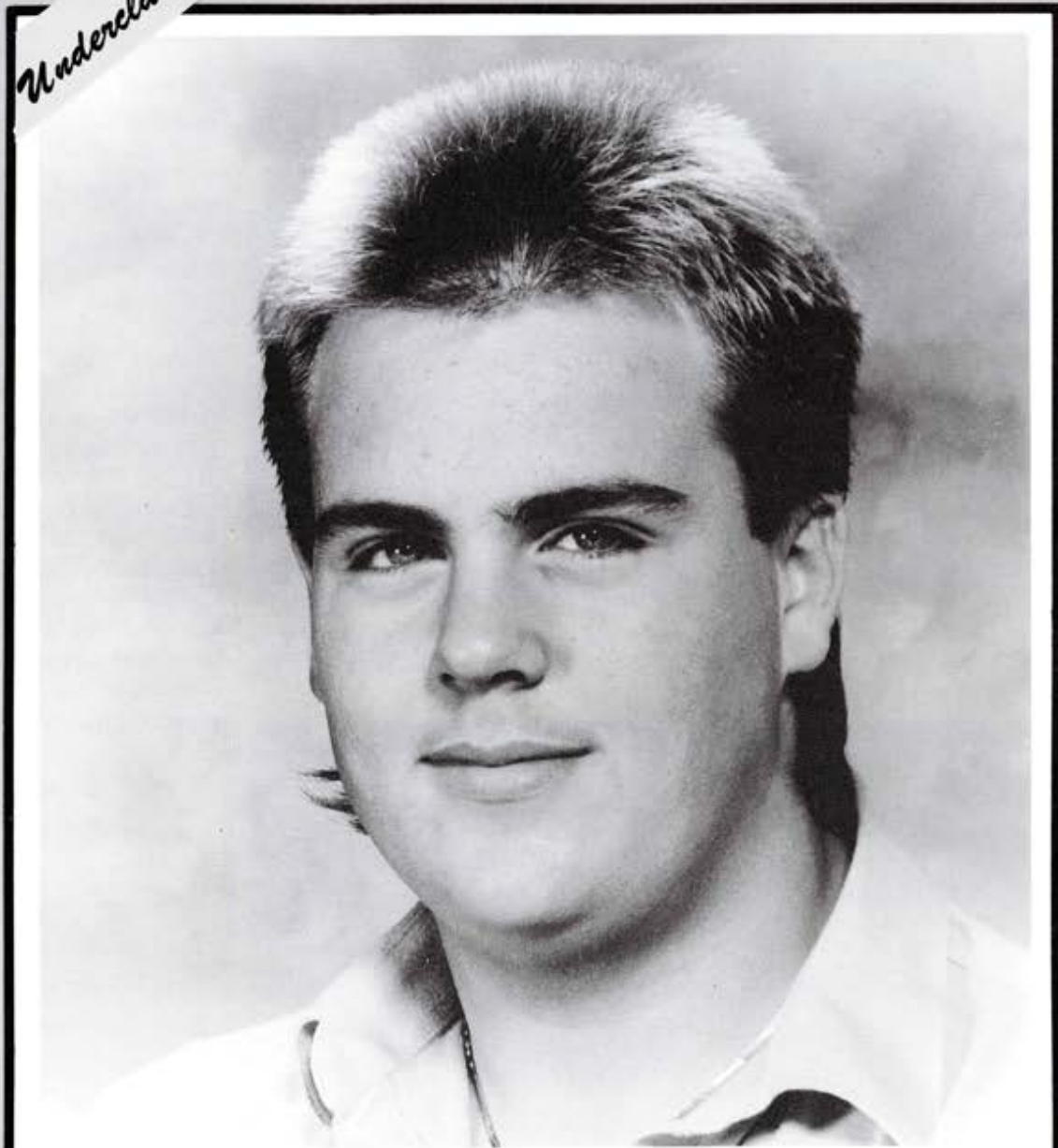

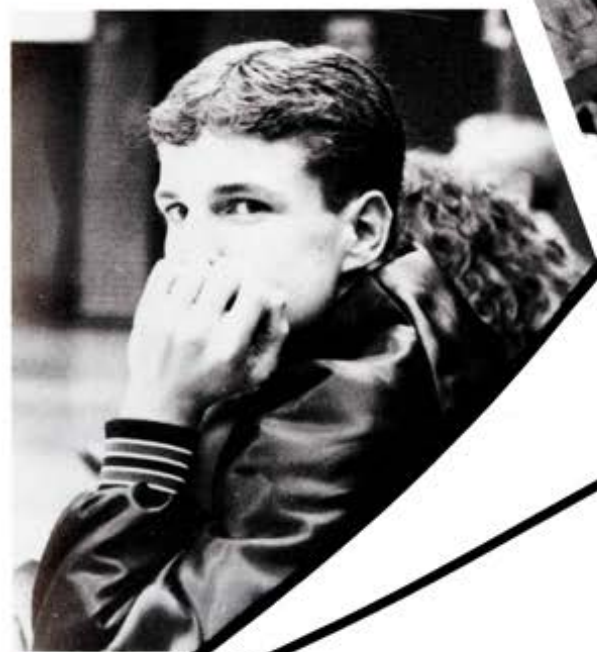
