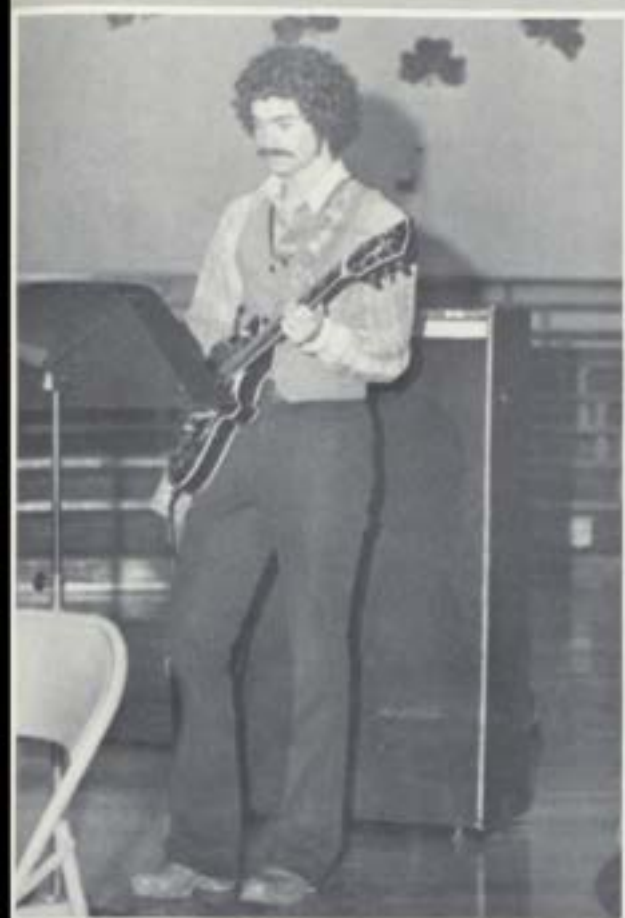
# Visitors

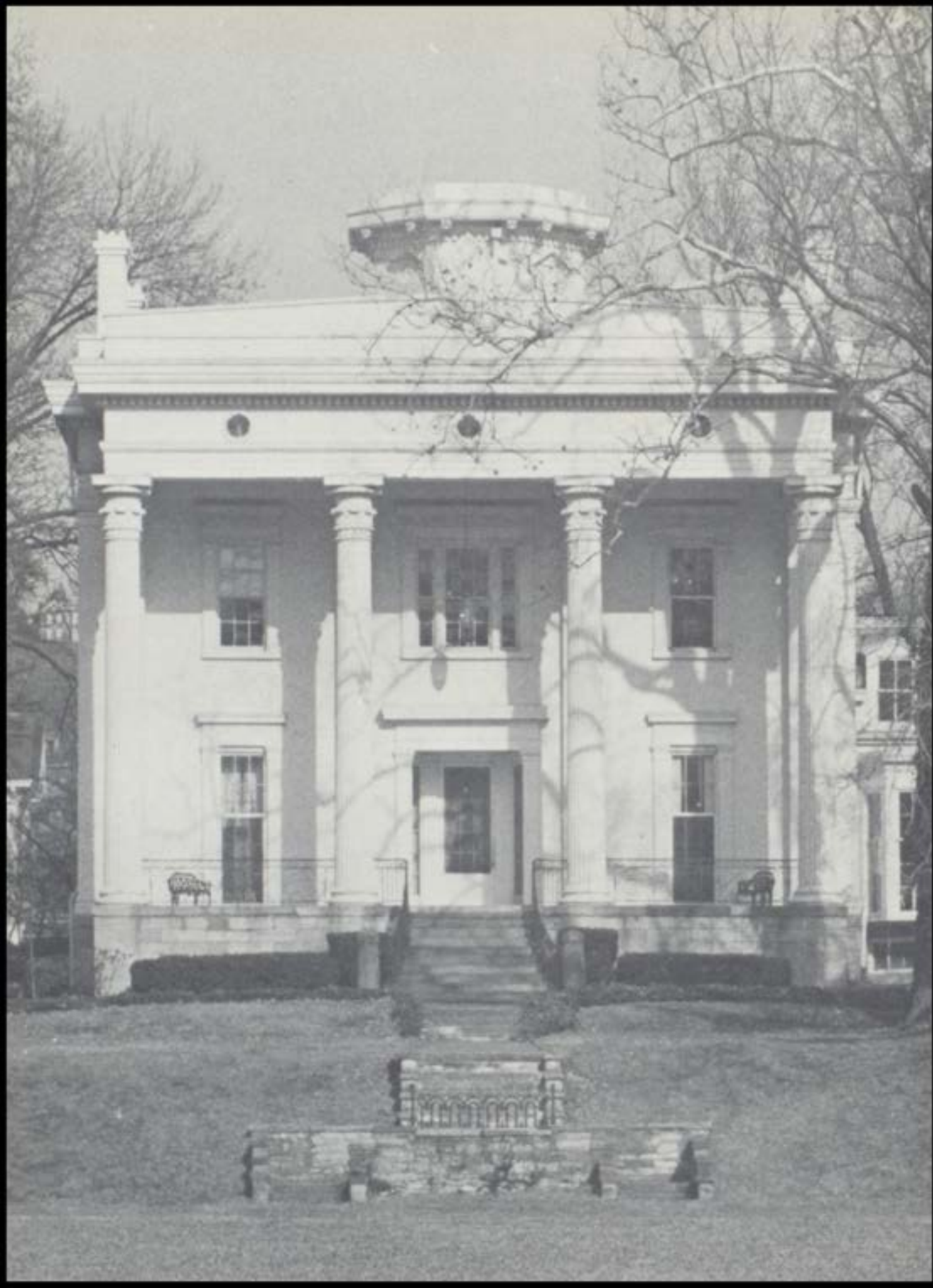









