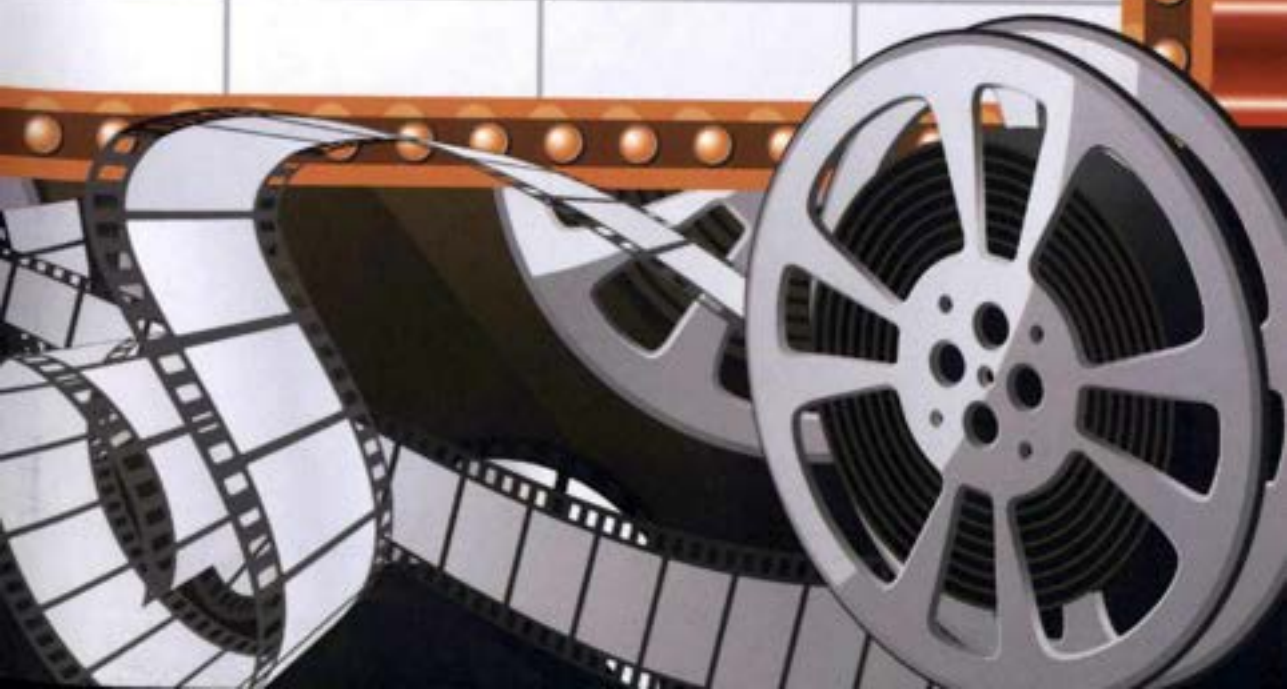

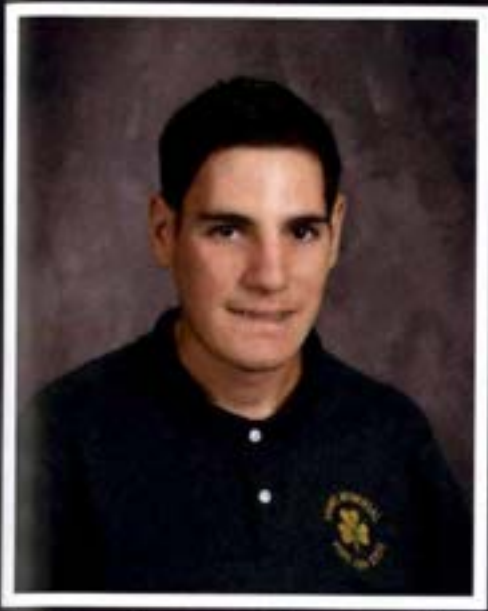

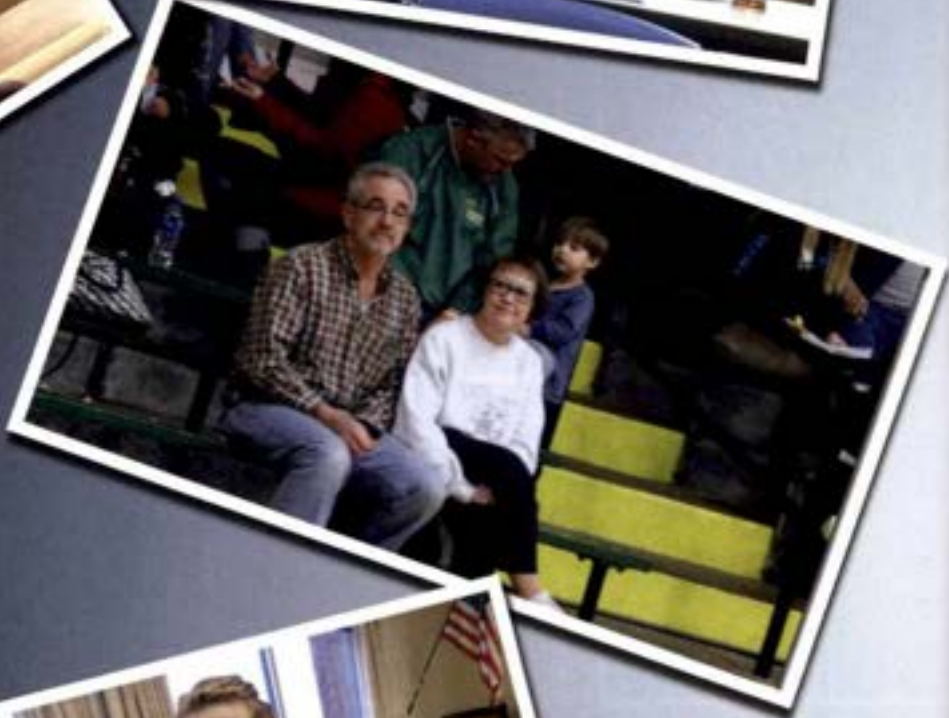

# FOREIGN LANGUAGE

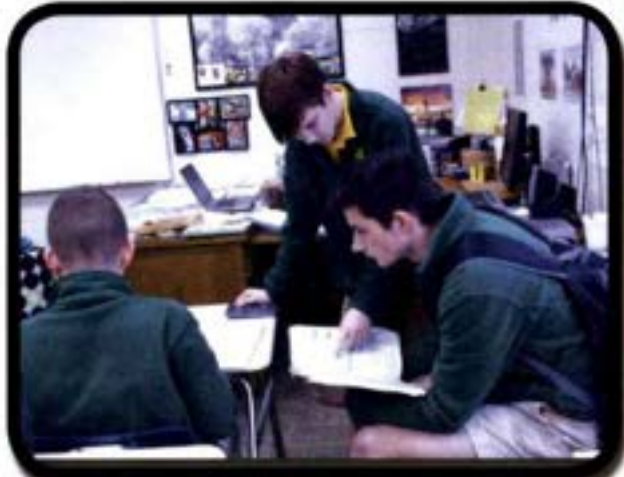

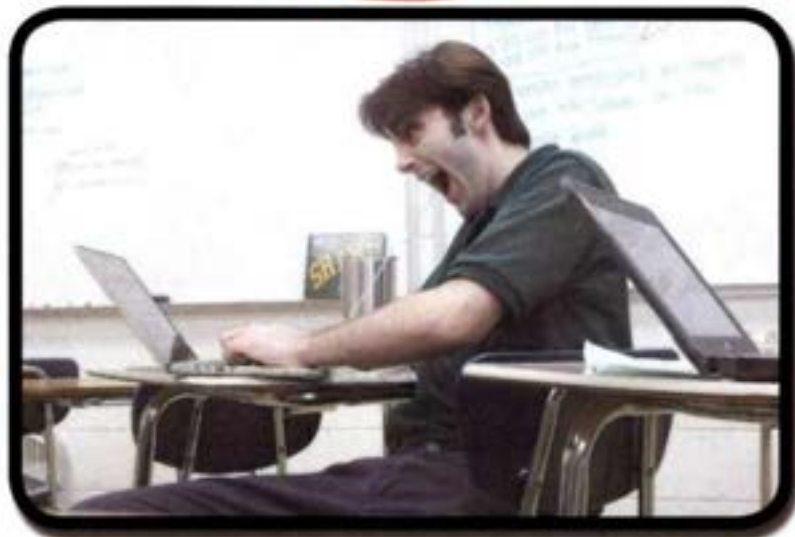

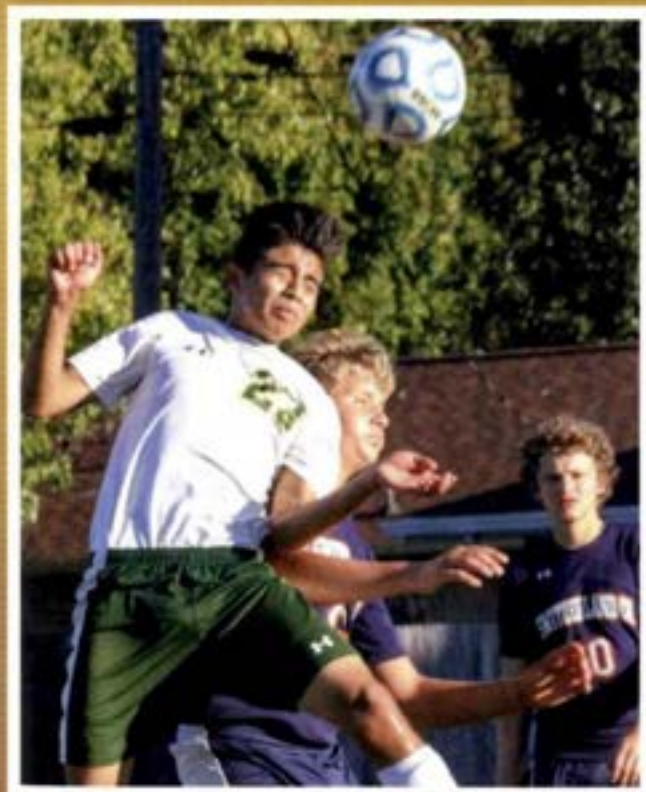

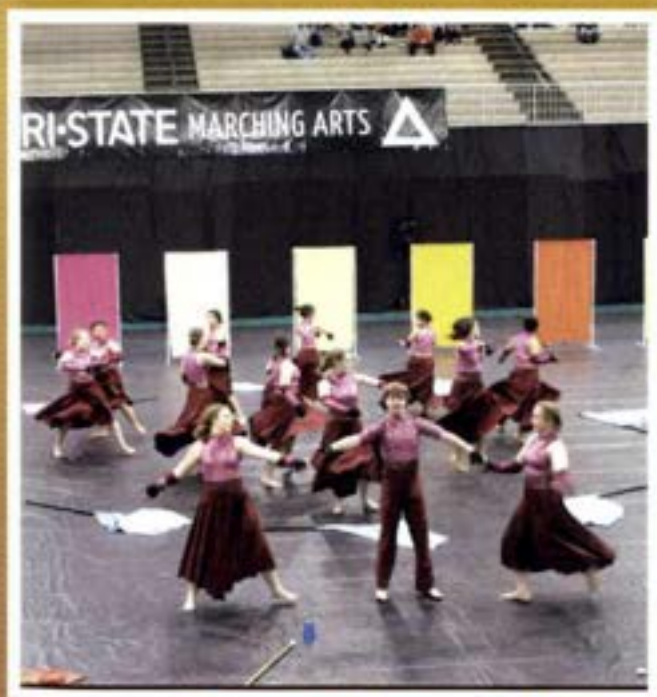

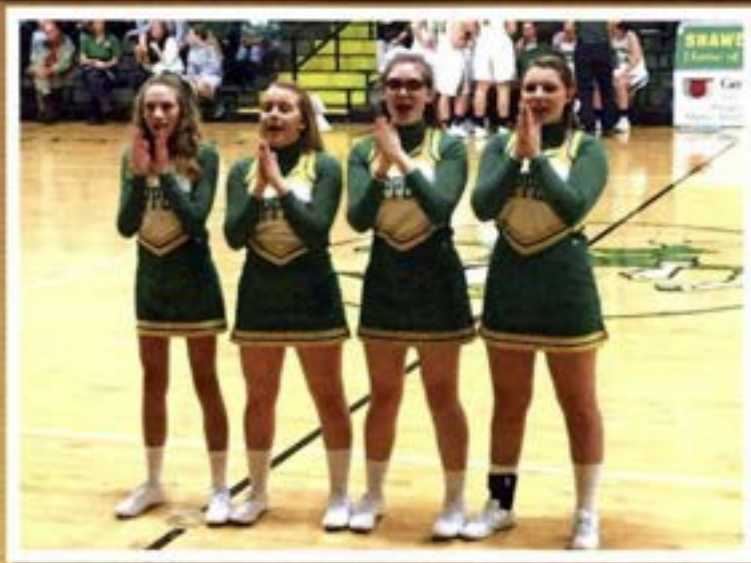

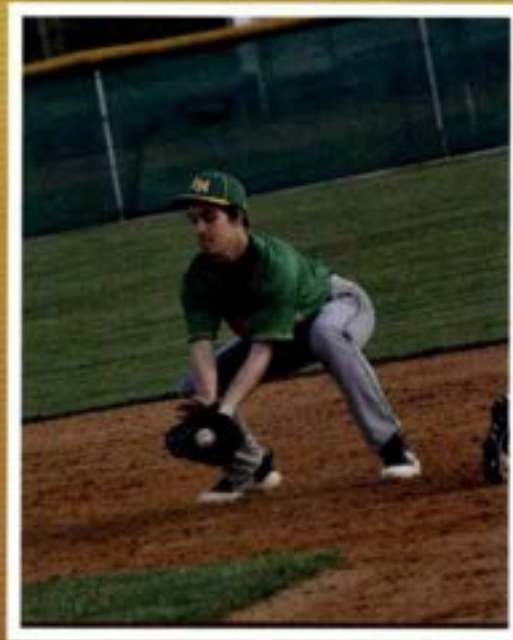


# HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL
