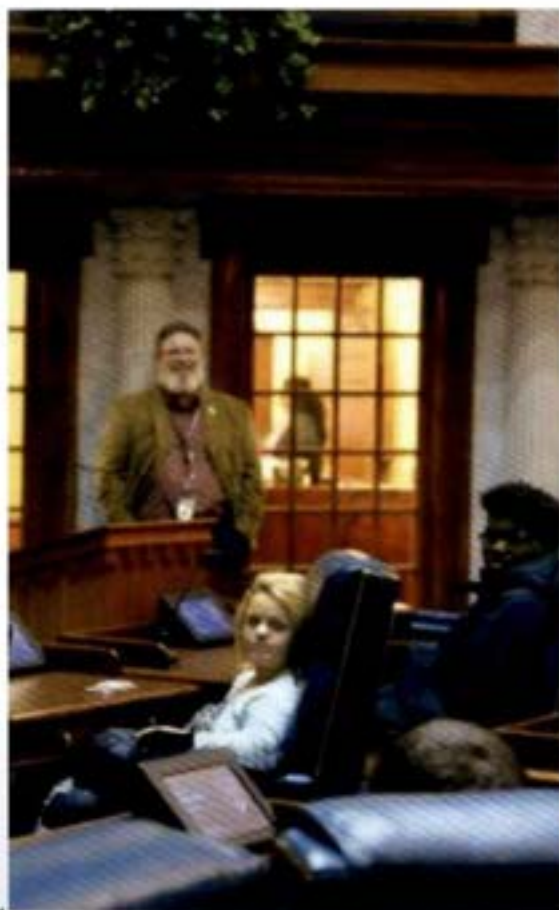
This year the Math Department welcomed Mr Ison to Shawe. He is also the girls JV basketball coach. We think he was drawing up plays on the board.

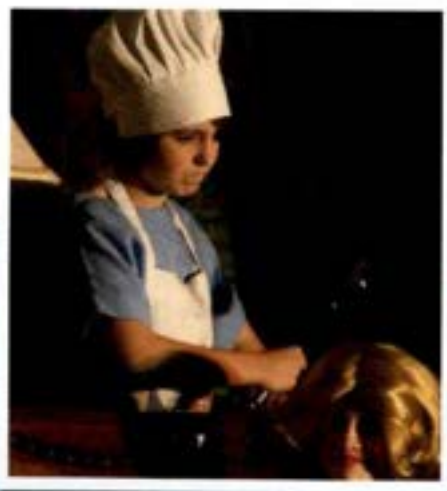




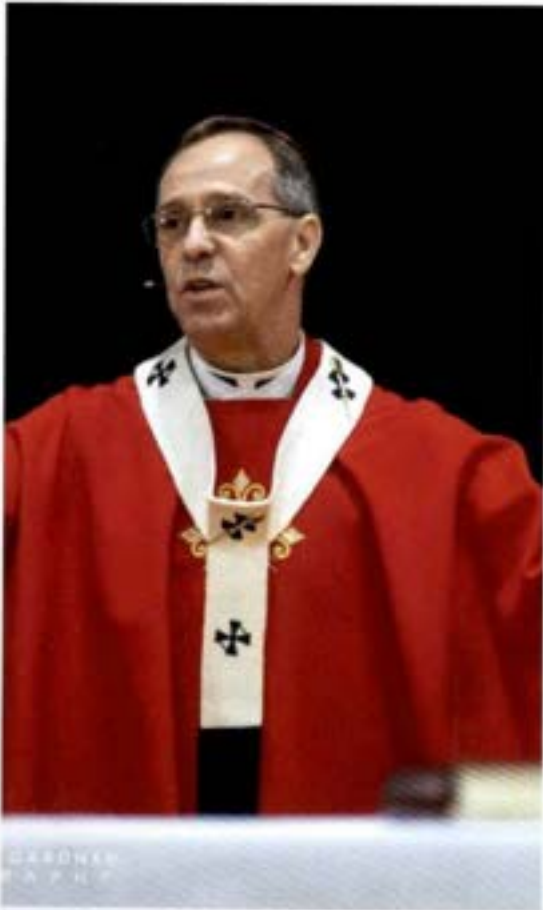

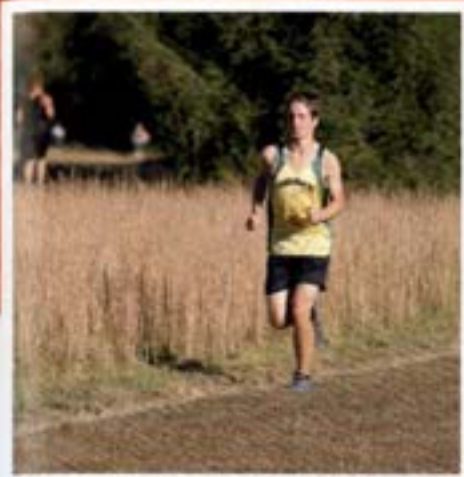


Although this year's team was young, they managed to pull through. They gave their best performance and never gave up, no matter the conditions.

This year was a great soccer season. There was a lot of improvement among the players. many of the players will be moving up to the High School team next year. We are looking forward to more great seasons in the years to come.



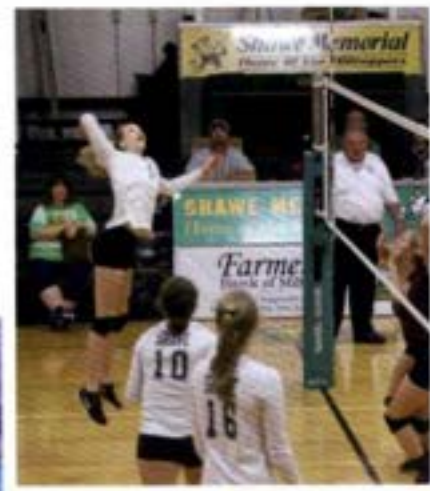
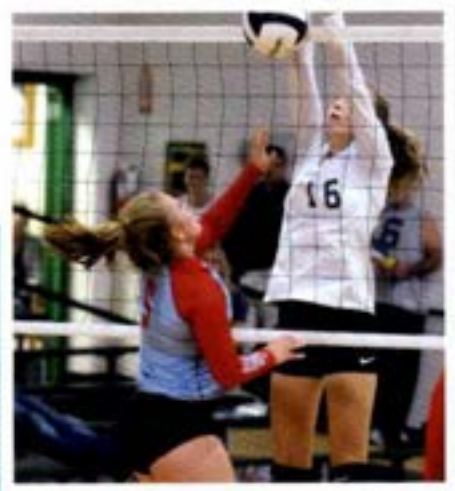


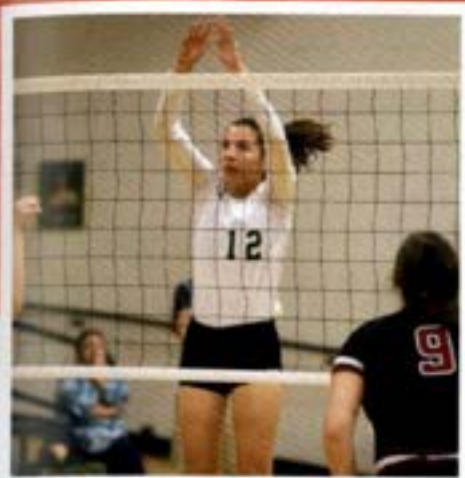


HIGH SCHOOL VOLLEYBALL

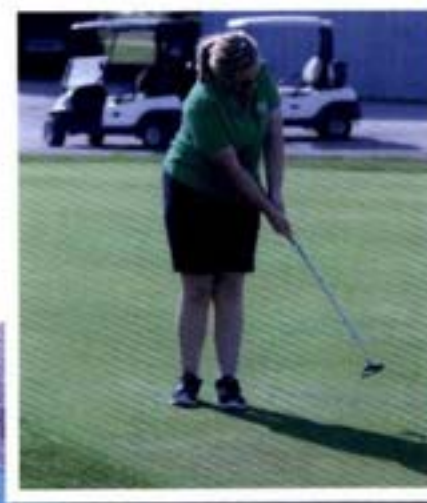






GOLF

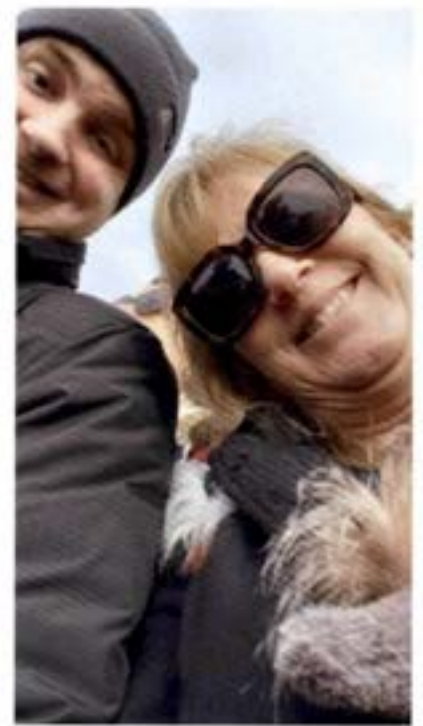

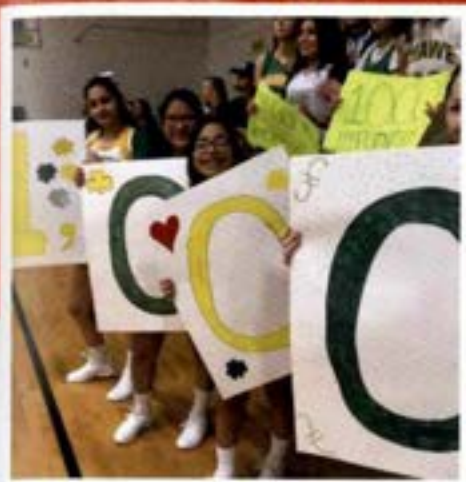


HIGH SCHOOL BOYS BASKETBALL

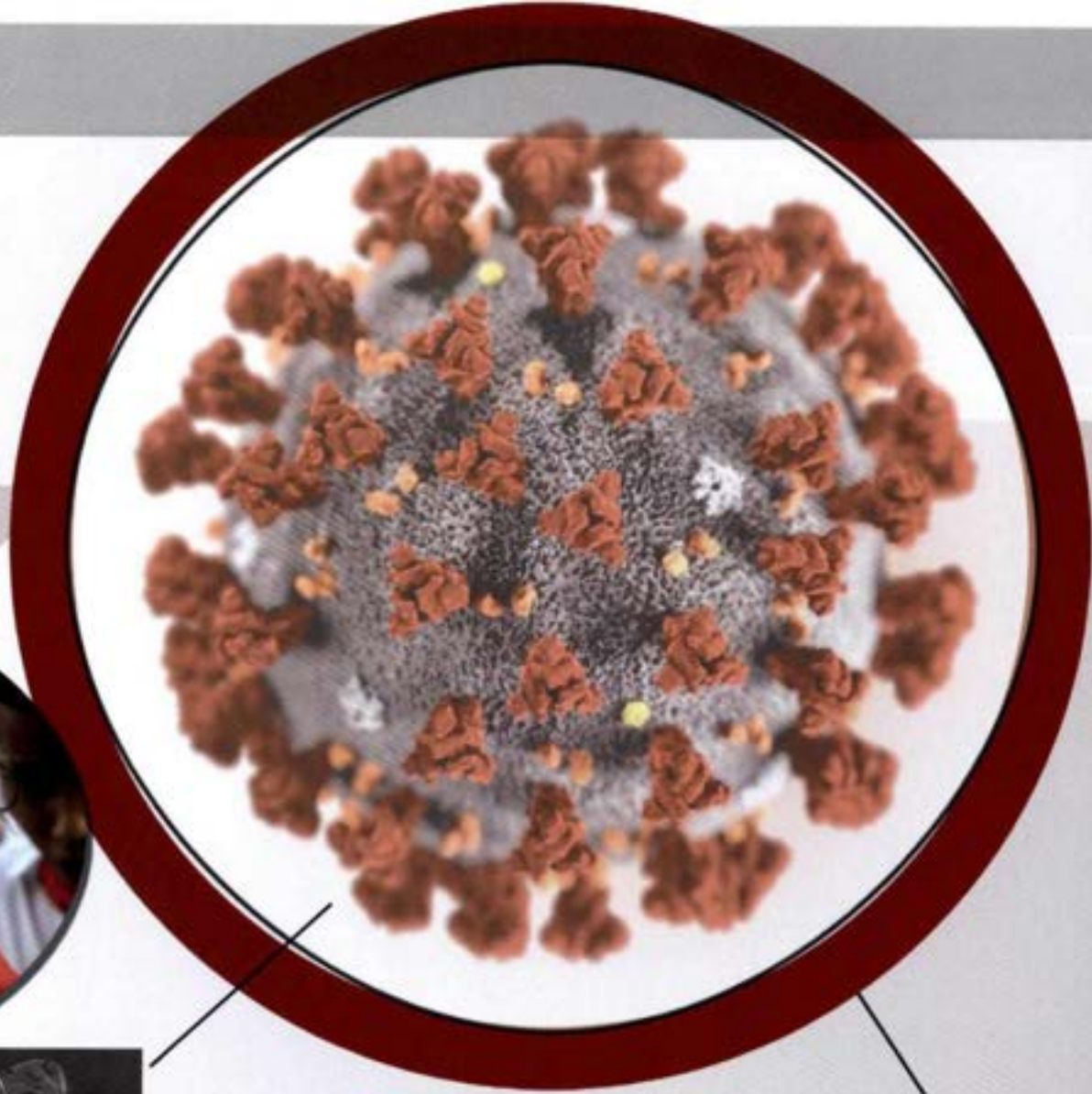
CORONAVIRUS

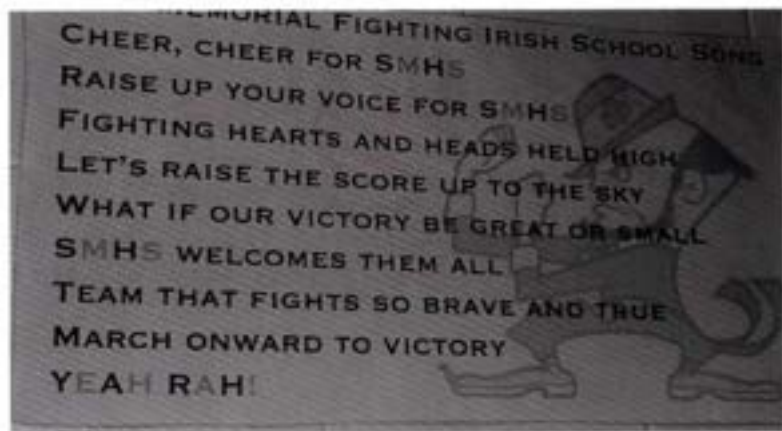

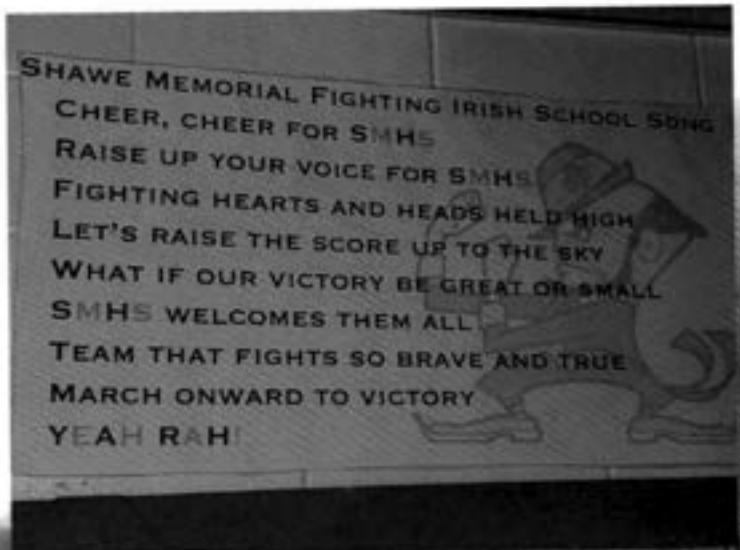






The Season That Wasn't

Home Sweet Quarantine!

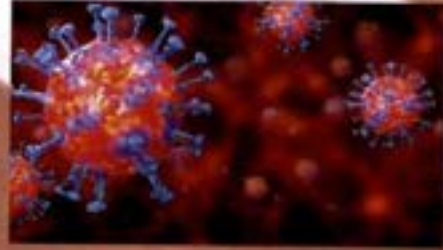

Timeline of the Coronavirus-19 Pandemic

December 31, 2019
Chinese officials in Wuhan confirmed dozens of cases of pneumonia from an unknown cause.



January 7, 2020
Outbreak is identified as a new Coronavirus.

January 11
China reports it's first death due to the Coronavirus.

January 21
The United States announced its first confirmed coronavirus case appearing in Washington state.

Jan. 30
The World Health Organization declared the outbreak a global public health emergency with more than 9,000 cases worldwide, including 18 countries other than China.

Feb. 11
WHO announced that the new coronavirus disease will be called COVID-19.

Feb. 24
Italy became the worst-hit country in Europe with the number of affected people spiking.



The U.S. stock market plummeted over coronavirus related fears following the Dow Jones Industrial Average experiencing the worst day in two years.

Feb. 26
California announced the first case in the U.S. but with no clear source of exposure.

March 6
Trump signed an \$8.3 billion emergency spending package to help combat the coronavirus outbreak with the number of global cases at 100,000.



March 11
The World Health Organization characterized the coronavirus as a pandemic, defined as the worldwide spread of a new disease for which most people do not have immunity.

March 12

MLB announced that it will suspend spring training and delay the start of the regular baseball season by at least two weeks.

The NHL announced that it will pause its hockey season with no set end date for the suspension.

The NCAA canceled both the men's and women's college basketball tournaments (March Madness) since most conferences suspended their postseason tournaments.



March 13

The World Health Organization said Europe "has now become the epicenter" of the pandemic

March 21

New York State leads the U.S. in coronavirus cases, totalling over 10,000.

March 22

President Trump announced that he would activate the federal National Guard to assist Washington, California and New York as these were the three states hit hardest by the pandemic.

March 23

Team USA's Olympic and Paralympic Committee surveyed more than 1,700 athletes and issued a statement urging the International Olympic Committee to postpone the 2020 Olympic Summer Games in Tokyo.



New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo announced the state will begin three studies of potential coronavirus treatments in the coming week, as the state's number of confirmed cases grew to more than 20,000.

March 25

The Senate passed a massive \$2 trillion stimulus package designed to ease the economic blow from the coronavirus pandemic. The bill was subsequently sent to the House.
